In answer to your question, "Do we have any information on angiosarcoma cases of the liver in the state of Connecticut?", the following information is available at this time.

There have been six "reported" cases including:

- a) 1950, one case in the Windsor Locks area, the diagnosis is questionable.
- b) 1967, one case in Bridgeport (a fireman) which was positively diagnosed.
- c) 1972, two cases in the Fairfield-Bridgeport area, both were positively diagnosed.
- d) 1973, two cases in the Fairfield-Bridgeport area. One case was positively confirmed. The other was in a General Electric worker who had "direct exposure" with vinyl chloride. This case is still of a questionable diagnosis.
