The only defendant of interest besides Armstrong is Mundet Cork. Mr. Staples had about 10 years of pipe covering work, including less than a year total with "Armstrong Construction". The claim was filed May 17, 1962. The parties applied to the Commission for approval of a Compromise and Release Agreement January 11, 1963, and this was approved February 14, 1963. Total amount paid was \$9,250, of which \$821.80 came from Armstrong's carrier, Travelers. It appears from the reports of doctors from both sides that Staples had partial disability from asbestosis, at the age of 37.

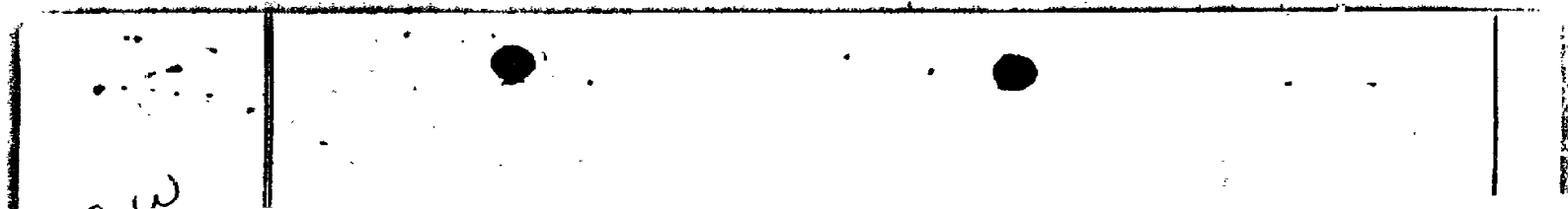

The parties hereto, for the purpose of Compromise only, hereby submit the following agreed statement of fact.

1. That John D. Staples, the applicant herein, was born on June 24, 1925.
2. That John Staples, while employed as a heating and air conditioning Installer, for Armstrong Construction, C. F. Braun, Cal State Company, Coast Insulating, R. T. Dinwiddle, Fiberglass Engineering, L. A. Cork, Kircher Asbestos, Mundet Cork Corp, a corporation, Oil Field Construction Company, Plant Asbestos Company, a corporation, Baker Perkins, Reece Insulation Company, Clark Reece, dba, J. T. Thorpe and Weber Baking Company, at various wages, at various geographic locations within and without the County of Los Angeles, State of California, during the periods of October, 1953 through March 7, 1962, alleges that he sustained one or more injuries to his lungs and respiratory system during said periods of employment by being continually exposed to asbestos dust, fiberglass and other irritants from materials handled and used during said employment.

1 3. That John D. Staples, alleges that as a result of the said
2 injuries, he has suffered a permanent disability.

3 4. That during the periods alleged, the insurance companies were

That the above employers and insurance carriers are, by agree-
ment, parties to this Compromise and Release. That it is expressly

1 understood, and intended by each and all of the parties hereto,
2 that the amount set forth below will be paid and received in con-
3 sideration of the release of the above named insurance carriers
4 and each of them, together with a release of each and all of the
5 above named employers.

6 It is further agreed that the release herein and hereby
7 granted by the applicant shall extend and inure to the benefit of
8 any and all employers, whether named in this proceeding or not.

9 5. That the actual weekly wages of the employee at the time of
10 the claimed injuries are in dispute; that the average weekly
11 wages are in dispute.

12 6. That applicant contends that he was temporarily disabled as a
13 result of his injuries; that defendants and each of them deny that
14 applicant was temporarily disabled from his employment due to any
15 injury or injuries.

16 7. That medical treatment was necessary and that such treatment
17 was obtained by applicant on a self-procured basis.

18 8. That the parties hereby agree to settle any and all claims on
19 account of said injuries by payment of the sum of \$9,250.00,
20 apportioned as follows:

21 The above sum of \$9,250.00 shall be paid in one lump sum to
22 applicant except as otherwise provided in item 8 (a) below, less
23 \$500.00 advanced by Industrial Indemnity Company, less any allow-
24 able lien claims of record not satisfied as itemized in item 8 (a)
25 below; that applicant agrees to pay any and all expenses incurred
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1 which may have otherwise been properly claimed under Labor Code
2 Section 4600 to have been the responsibility of the defendants
3 herein.

4 8. (a) That the sum of \$9,250.00 shall have deducted the follow-
5 ing disbursements which shall be made directly to those persons,
6 companies, corporations or firms as set forth below and such dis-
7 bursements shall be made from the amount designated to be paid by
8 Industrial Indemnity Company as set forth in Item #8 above; that
9 the herein disbursements represent reduced lien claims of record
10 and are payable in amounts as follows:

- 11 1. Less \$50.⁰⁰ to Silver & McWilliams for living expenses advanced.
12 2. \$996.²² To DEPT. OF EMPLOYMENT.
13

14 That any sums due by said Company not exhausted by disburse-
15 ment or attorneys' fees set forth in Item #10 below shall be paid
16 directly to the applicant or as the Honorable Commission may
17 direct.

18 9. That all self procured medical, if any, shall be the sole
19 responsibility of the applicant and that the defendants, or any
20 of them, shall not be liable for any of said expense. That the
21 defendants or their carriers, are responsible for medical treat-
22 ment and/or examinations here-to-fore authorized by them, but
23 that all future medical shall be the sole responsibility of the
24 applicant herein.

25 10. That the name and address of applicant's attorneys is Silver
26 McWilliams and Sherman, 305½ North Avalon Boulevard, Wilmington,
27 California; that said attorneys request a fee to be paid directly
28 to them by Aetna Casualty and Surety Company, as set forth in
29 Item #8 (a) above, in the total amount of \$As set by IAC. That
30 said attorneys have expended the sum of \$ None as
31 reasonable litigation costs.

32 11. Reason For Compromise: Multiple issues exist which make

1 settlement the most practical solution to the problem posed by
2 protracted litigation as follows: whether applicant's injuries
3 arose out of and were sustained in the course and scope of employ-
4 ment; date of injury; issue of occupational disease; applicability
5 of the Statute of Limitations; extent of apportionment allowable
6 as between defendants; applicant's actual earnings; applicant's
7 average earnings; extent and duration of temporary disability, if
8 any; nature, extent and duration of permanent disability, if any;
9 need for further medical treatment; liability for self procured
10 medical; liability for medical legal costs; allowance of reduction
11 of lien claims; coverage for the periods of employment alleged.

12 The applicant desires a lump sum settlement and to take con-
13 trol of his own medical treatment. The applicant, and the de-
14 fendants, separately and as a group, desire to buy their peace and
15 to avoid the expense, delay, hazard and uncertainty of extended
16 litigation and to settle their differences for a sum certain. The
17 applicant feels that the liens of _____ and
18 _____ should be allowed in the sum of
19 \$ One Parag. 8 of the amount claimed.

20 12. The undersigned request that this Compromise and Release
21 Agreement be approved by the Honorable Commission.

22 13. Upon approval of this Compromise and Release Agreement by the
23 Industrial Accident Commission or a panel thereof and payment in
24 accordance with the provisions hereof, said employee releases and
25 forever discharges said employers and insurance carriers from all
26 claims and causes of action, whether known or ascertained, or
27 which may hereafter arise or develop as a result of said injuries,
28 including any and all liabilities of said employers and said
29 insurance carriers and each of them to the dependants, heirs,
30 executors, representatives, administrators or assigns of said
31 employee.

32 14. It is agreed by all parties hereto that the filing of this

document is the filing of an application for adjustment of all claims on behalf of the employee, and that the Commission may in its discretion set the matter for hearing as a regular application, reserving to the parties the right to put in issue any of the facts submitted herein, and that if hearing is held with this document used as an application, the defendants shall have available to them all defenses that were available as of the date of filing of this document, and that the Commission may thereafter either approve such a Compromise and Release Agreement or disapprove the same and issue Findings and Award after hearing has been held and the matter regularly submitted for decision.

15. In further consideration of the payment in accordance herewith, applicant agrees that this release applies to all unknown and unanticipated injuries and damages resulting from such actions, casualties, events and/or employments, as well as those now disclosed, and all rights under section 1542 of the Civil Code of the State of California are hereby waived. California Civil Code Section 1542 reads as follows:

"A general release does not extend to claims which the creditor does not know or suspect to exist in his favor at the time of executing the release, which if known, by him, must have materially effected his settlement with the debtor."

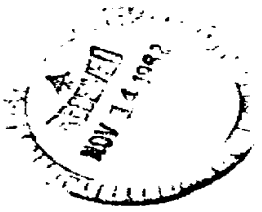

Dear Mr. McWilliams:

On April 25, 1962, I sent a letter to you regarding Mr. John Staples. Please refer to this letter for information concerning Mr. Staples prior to this date.

This patient has been seen subsequent to the last letter as follows:

- 4-30-62 Conjunctivitis - Cough continues - Rales in chest continue
- 5-10-62 Worse past 2 days "had to go to bed" Cough and rales persist. Diathermy, etc.
- 5-15-62 Some improved, complains of weakness
- 5-28-62. Pt. failed to keep appointment
- 5-31-62 Complains of difficulty breathing. Temperature remains normal. Rales in left lung field persist.
- 6-25-62 About the same. Sent to the laboratory for lung vital Capacity. Laboratory report patients vital capacity is 50% of normal.
- 7-2-62 Patient still complains of weakness - X-rays ordered to be repeated at the La Mirada Hospital. Patient instructed to completely stop smoking.

Upon contacting La Mirada Hospital, on 8-21-62, I found Mr. Staples had failed to have follow-up x-rays. They informed me that the patient had not been in for the x-rays that I had ordered on July 2, 1962. I have not seen this patient since July 2, 1962 in my office.

My recommendations as stated in the letter of 4-25-62 remain unchanged. I feel this patient should not be employed in any occupation where lung irritants are involved. X-ray and laboratory tests substantiate the diagnosis of pulmonary fibrosis and probable asbestosis. Vital capacity is reduced to 50% of normal.

Re: John D. Staples

Mr. Staples has been under my care for a chest problem since March 8, 1962. He has had a chronic cough, hemoptysis and pain in chest area, both right and left. He was hospitalized March 9, 1962 at Murphy Memorial Hospital with acute pneumonitis.

Repeated x-rays of his lungs have shown evidence of chronic irritation. He has consistently had fine rales in left low lung fields and coughs frequently. His condition has become better with treatment but has not subsided entirely. Due to the pulmonary findings on the x-ray examination and after discussing this case with the radiologist at La Mirada Hospital, Dr. Richard Siggers, it was felt wise to advise this patient to seek a different occupation. It was so felt because the lung fields showed fibrosis and there was evidence of chronic irritation. And, due to the fact that the patient is working in asbestos, where he is exposed to asbestos dust and fibers and due to the fact that asbestos can cause and can irritate such a condition, I felt that he should definitely seek employment where his lungs would not be subject to this type of irritation.

I feel that continued exposure to lung irritants will lead to more fibrosis and repeated acute pulmonary episodes which he had when I first saw him. The likelihood of active tuberculosis and heart disease would be increased.

It is therefore my recommendation that Mr. John Staples seek employment in a field of endeavor not requiring contact with lung irritants.

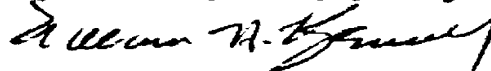

Gentlemen:

At your request the above captioned individual was examined by the writer on 8-9-62. He gave his address as 10634 Cores, Whittier, Calif. His occupation as an insulator.

HISTORY: Mr. Staples states that in March of 1962 he developed pneumonia. For this he was cared for by Dr. Frolick and was hospitalized in the Murphy Memorial Hospital in Whittier. X-rays were taken and according to the patient the doctor first suspected that he might have tuberculosis. A number of tests were run but, according to the patient, none of these showed evidence of pulmonary tuberculosis. The patient was then told that the lungs might have been affected by the fiberglass and asbestos. Mr. Staples also states that he had a cardio respiratory test which, according to him, showed about "50% capacity." The patient has not worked since March on the recommendation of his doctor.

Present Complaints:

1. "I do not have any energy."
2. "I am short of breath on effort. This has been coming on for the past year."
3. "Occasionally I feel a sort of constriction in my chest."

Past Medical History: Had an appendectomy. He had pneumonia two years ago and also in March of 1962. He had a whiplash injury two years ago.

Occupational History: Mr. Staples states that he has been in the insulating business for approximately ten years with the exception of one period of nine months. He has worked for various companies for various periods of time. If I understood Mr. Staples correctly he has worked the longest for the Plant Asbestos Company. This being approximately three to four years although not constantly. He has worked for the Coast Insulating Products, for the Armstrong Corporation, and Baker-Perkins Company.

For these various companies his work is primarily as follows.

He wrapped pipe or ducts with fiberglass cloth. On top of the fiberglass in some instances is placed an asbestos covering. The asbestos has previously been molded. He estimated that the use of asbestos as compared to the use of fiberglass was considerably less. In other words the percentage of asbestos was very little compared with that of fiberglass.

Personal History: The patient is married, wife and four children living. He knows of no tuberculosis, cancer or diabetes in the family history.

Inventory of Systems:

Head - States that he has occasional headache, no dizziness or tinnitus. His tonsils have been removed. Teeth are false.
Respiratory system - Has a morning cough which is occasionally productive. He has never expectorated any blood.
Cardiac - Has some dyspnea on effort, occasional palpitation and occasional constriction-like discomfort. Has no orthopnea.
Gastro-intestinal - Appetite is normal. Has no symptoms of indigestion. Has no constipation or diarrhea. Stools are normal.
Genito-urinary - No nocturia, dysuria or frequency.
Weight - Patient states that he did lose about 17 pounds on a diet but is regaining some of this.
Nervous system - States that the doctor placed him on Miltown because of he was somewhat nervous, he is not irritable and he sleeps well.
Extremities - No history of ankle edema, joint pain or joint enlargement.

Habits: Smokes about one pack of cigarettes a day. Does not drink alcoholic beverages.

PHYSICAL EXAMINATION: The patient is a normal appearing, normally intelligent cooperative 37 year old male.
His weight was 177 pounds. Temperature normal.
Head and Neck: The pupils were round, equal and reacted to light. Ears, nose and throat negative. The teeth were false. No enlargement of the cervical glands.
Chest: Slightly emphysematous in appearance. The percussion note was resonant throughout. Auscultation of the lungs revealed no friction rubs or rales. Respiratory rate 18.
Heart: Rate of 76; regular, no murmurs heard. B.P. 110/70.
Abdomen: Obese, no organs or masses palpated. No tenderness elicited. There is present an old scar from previous operation.
Back: Motions of the back were painful due to a recent strain.
Extremities: Normal. No ankle edema present.
Neurological examination: Normal.

ELECTROCARDIOGRAM: Normal.

X-RAY EXAMINATION: Posterior anterior and lateral views of the chest reveal the cardiac shadow to be within normal limits. There are old egg-shell calcifications of both hilar areas. There is one small calcification in the left lower periphery. There is slight accentuation of the bronchovascular markings and a few scattered micronodules.

DISCUSSION: The physical examination of Mr. Staples was essentially normal. Likewise the urinalysis, blood count were normal. The blood sedimentation rate was slightly elevated. The electrocardiogram was normal.

From the history there are two types of dust to be considered in this case. The first is that of fiberglass. This material is notorious for causing a mechanical irritation to the skin. However it is not known to cause any effect upon the pulmonary tissue. This is not any arbitrary statement based upon my own experience. It is based upon the additional opinions of other clinicians and those engaged in research in industrial toxicology. The references to the following quoted material are appended to this report.

In a clinical study by Carpenter and Spolyer, "In a clinical study negative chest findings were observed in a mineral wool industry." According to Gardner, "The lack of pulmonary damage from exposure to glass wool dust is being demonstrated by an inhalation experiment. For over a year animals have now been exposed to as high concentrations of this material as could be obtained, with no serious effect upon their lungs."

In 1959, Schepers et al of the Saranac Laboratory (Trudeau Foundation) reported on the biological action of fiberglass-plastic dust on rats, rabbits, guinea pigs and monkeys. According to these investigators, "this fiberglass dust behaved like an inert substance. This is a most portentous finding, as it is so

frequently assumed that all siliceous dusts necessarily must be injurious when inhaled." In view of the fact that in the pneumoconioses "the main causes of disability or death are pulmonary fibrosis, emphysema and bronchitis, vascular occlusion with cor pulmonale and secondary infection, mainly tuberculosis these animals were carefully studied with these complications in mind. "The fiberglas-plastic dust provoked no serious lesions of the foregoing categories."

On the other hand asbestos fibers are respirable. Under a given set of circumstances they can give rise to a pneumoconiosis known as asbestosis. It is believed that it takes from seven to ten years in a fairly high concentration of asbestos fibers to develop asbestosis.

In the case of Mr. Staples no positive opinion can be given at this time. Certainly this is so from the standpoint of interpreting the x-ray films. Pendergrass, a radiologist who has probably the greatest experience in interpreting x-ray films in the field of pneumoconioses states "a roentgenological diagnosis of early asbestosis is unreliable." With this I agree and I fail to understand how any other doctor could state that the x-ray films of Mr. Staples represent asbestosis or any other pneumoconiosis.

Before any opinion can be offered in this case an investigation is necessary that would include a determination of the presence or absence of asbestos fibers in the working environment, a determination of concentration and particle size and an estimation of actual or fairly approximate length of time that there has been any exposure to asbestos. After this is done and there remains evidence of the need, a lung biopsy could be made. As previously stated, no positive opinion can be made presently. At this time it is my impression that Mr. Staples does not have asbestosis or any pulmonary disturbance from fiberglas. Furthermore, I believe he could return to work.

I examined Mr. Staples on September 11, 1962, and the results of my examination and laboratory studies are as follows:

A. Chief Complaint: Shortness of breath, chest pains, frequent chest colds and pneumonia in March 1962 from which he feels he has never fully recovered and which he feels all are due to asbestos inhalation.

B. History of Present Illness: Mr. Staples is a 37-year-old white male who has the following occupational history. He has been a heat and frost insulator working with asbestos for the past nine years. Prior to this, he drove a truck, owned and worked in service stations primarily. He worked for North American Aviation for six months in 1950. At no time in his prior occupations was he exposed to any dust or asbestos or any type of inhalant.

In the past nine years, he worked for nine or ten different companies in the same occupation. His job always involved installations of heating or air conditioning insulation on the job in many types of building construction. This involved carrying asbestos or fiberglass to various parts of installations, cutting and fitting it around pipes or ducts. The asbestos was occasionally put on in a semi-liquid form, molded and dried on a fitting like a plaster cast. He never wore a mask except on one occasion when he was opening bags of asbestos and pouring it into a mixer. He had no other occasion to use a mixer or pour bags of asbestos.

He never noted any adverse affects from this work until he began noticing shortness of breath about one year ago. He noted that he was getting tired and short of breath in the early afternoons at the job. He would pick up something and couldn't carry it very far because

of this shortness of breath. He noted an increase in his usual "cigarette cough." Less and less activity produced more and more shortness of breath but he continued to work until he got pneumonia in early March 1962. At that time, he was hospitalized with fever, chills, lightheadedness and a productive cough including streaks of bright red blood in the sputum. He had X-rays and sputum studies and tuberculosis was not found although initially suspected. He was given antibiotics but required no oxygen. He was told that this was due to asbestos and he should not return to his usual occupation. He has had episodes of feeling better but then if he gets a cold and his cough increases, he gets very short of breath. Generally, he produces almost no sputum in the morning - if he does it is only a teaspoonful or two. It is very stringy and brown in color. He has taken penicillin but became allergic to it so now he takes sulphaz when he gets an infection. He takes no bronchodilators or other lung medication. He has had no wheezing attacks prior or since the pneumonia.

He has smoked cigarettes for 25 or 26 years at the rate of one and one-half to two packs per day for many years and two to two and one-half packs the year prior to the pneumonia. He has smoked one pack a day since his pneumonia.

C. Past History: He was born in Missouri and came to California in 1939. He served in the U.S. Navy from 1943 to 1946 and spent two years in the Pacific Theater. He was not sick or wounded except that both ear drums were ruptured from concussion blasts. He denies any intake of alcohol since 1949 but states that briefly before that date, he drank fairly heavily for one or two years. Family History - His father is living at age 60 and has pulmonary emphysema. His mother is living at age 57 and is in good health. One sister is living at age 40 and is in good health. He has been married 17 1/2 years. His wife is 40 and in good health. There are four children, one of whom is a son age eight who has a ventricular septal defect. There is no family history of tuberculosis, cancer or any other serious disease except for the pulmonary disease which his father has.

He had the usual childhood illnesses. Adult Illnesses - He had mumps in the service and tonsillitis in 1959. Surgery - He had an appendectomy for a ruptured appendix in 1952 and tonsillectomy in 1959. System Review - His maximum weight has been 184 pounds, average weight 170 to 175. His hearing is decreased bilaterally because of the perforated ear drums. He sleeps with one pillow

and on his side. There has been no ankle edema. His appetite has been good.

D. Physical Examination: Height: 5'9". Temperature: 98. Pulse: 80. Blood Pressure: 100/70. Weight: 175 as ordinarily dressed. He appeared as a well developed, well nourished white male, alert, oriented and cooperative and in no breathing distress while at rest. On mild exercise in the office, consisting of rapid walking and bending, he exhibited objective evidence of mild respiratory distress. Head and Neck: Revealed no venous distention, thyroid enlargement or adenopathy. Eyes: Pupils, external ocular muscles and fundi were normal. Ear, Nose and Throat examination: Both tympanic membranes appeared to be intact and there was no decrease in hearing of the wrist watch tick. Chest: Revealed symmetrical respirations bilaterally with minimal restriction of chest motion. Lungs: Revealed slight decrease in breath sounds bilaterally with persistent rales at the left base laterally. Heart: Not clinically enlarged. There was regular sinus rhythm without thrills, murmurs or rubs. The second aortic sound equaled the second pulmonic sound. Abdomen: Obese. There were no organs, masses or tenderness noted; there was a well healed right lower quadrant scar. Genitalia: Revealed an atrophic left testicle. Neurological examination: Produced physiologic responses. Extremities: Revealed no clubbing, cyanosis or edema. The remainder of the physical examination was not remarkable.

E. Laboratory Data: Complete blood count - hemoglobin 15.6 grams; packed cell volume 46%; white blood count 8200 with a normal differential except for a slight lymphocytosis. Urinalysis - specific gravity 1.026; no abnormal chemical or urinary sediment findings. Sedimentation rate 18 mm. at the end of one hour. The CO₂ combining power 26 mEq. with a normal for our laboratory from 24 to 32 mEq. Electrocardiogram revealed a heart rate of 76; PR interval of .18; QRS .08; QT interval .36. The heart was in an intermediate electrical position with a transition zone at V-3 and normal R wave progression although there were slightly large R waves on the right side of the precordium. The impression was that of an electrocardiogram within normal limits. X-rays of the chest taken in the PA and left lateral projections in the inspiratory as well as expiratory phases revealed the cardiac silhouette to be unremarkable. Both hilar shadows were somewhat prominent and extensive calcification was present in both hilar areas. The lung markings were exaggerated throughout. The inspiratory and expiratory study revealed good motion of the diaphragms and no evidence

of emphysema radiographically. Pulmonary function tests performed at the Cardio-Pulmonary Laboratories of the Mt. Sinai Hospital revealed a slightly decreased or low normal vital capacity and moderately reduced maximal breathing capacity with low air velocity index. The impression was that of "minimal airway obstruction without hyperinflation. This will be consistent with mild asthma or bronchitis. There is no emphysema."

F. Discussion: It is my impression that the combination of a long history of exposure to asbestos and the X-ray findings of exaggerated lung markings consistent with early pulmonary fibrosis plus additional evidence of dyspnea on exertion, make asbestosis a medical probability. At this time, the degree of pulmonary impairment is minimal but a more exact evaluation of the pulmonary function can be determined by further and more elaborate tests such as blood gas analysis at rest and after exercise, as well as other studies which would indicate more precisely the degree of fibrosis present. An absolute diagnosis of asbestosis can only be made, however, on histologic grounds, after a lung biopsy. The chest X-ray shows evidence of numerous calcifications which reflect prior inflammatory disease of a nonindustrial nature and the element of his very long and heavy cigarette smoking must be considered. However, the history he presents and the X-ray changes present at his relatively young age make asbestosis a probability. Therefore, I feel that this is an industrial condition. I feel that his condition is permanent and stationary because the changes brought about by asbestos inhalation are not progressive once the patient is removed from the offending irritant, in contradistinction to such diseases such as silicosis which progress regardless of further exposure. For this reason, I feel that it would be most wise that this patient seek employment in another field of endeavor.

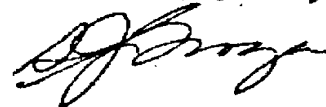

Gentlemen:

Compromise and Release will be submitted in the captioned matters in the near future in the amount of \$9,250.00. Inasmuch as the Department of Employment has filed a lien claim in the sum of \$1,868.00, this letter is written to assist the Commission in allocating a portion of the proceeds to said lien claimant.

Medical expenses to date are \$451.00, consisting of \$166.00 to Dr. George Fralick, \$145.00 to LaMirada Hospital and \$140.00 for X-rays and laboratory tests, or, in round figures, \$450.00, leaving a balance of \$8,800.00. Due to the nature of the applicant's condition, the sum of \$1,000.00 is allocated to future medical treatment and/or observation, leaving a balance of \$7,800.00 for temporary and permanent disability.

The period of temporary disability involved is March 7, 1962, to October 1, 1962, or, for purposes hereof, \$2,100.00. Based upon the nature and extent of the applicant's condition as reflected in the medical file and also because he will be unable to return to his trade, the potential permanent disability is estimated at 60 to 65%, or for purposes hereof, \$13,000.00. Total potential liability is therefore \$15,000.00, and, consequently, that portion of the balance of the proceeds which may be deemed based on liability for temporary disability is represented by the fraction 21/151 or \$1,084.00. For the period of temporary disability involved, compensation is payable under the terms of the settlement at the rate of \$5.21 per day; and inasmuch as the Department's lien covers a period of 182 days, they would be entitled to the sum of \$948.22 plus \$48.00 expended for hospitalization benefits or a total of \$996.22.

Considering all the facts and circumstances of the case, said sum is considered fair and equitable to all parties as the amount to be allocated to the Department.
