Dear Mr. Redmond:

I have been asked to answer your letter of April 7, 1969 concerning our product Pydraul F-9. I will answer your questions as you posed them.

1. Pydraul F-9 is a proprietary product which involves another company; we can not reveal its composition. We can tell you that it is a phosphate ester base fluid containing chlorinated hydrocarbons.
2. Pydraul has an open cup flash point of 430°F.
3. In connection with the chemical and physical properties of the product, I have enclosed a brief bulletin covering these properties.
4. Pydraul F-9 is a fire-resistant hydraulic fluid; it is used in the same fashion as other fluids of this type. Further information can be found in the enclosed bulletin.
5. Pydraul F-9 contains no heavy metals and no phenolic derivatives of consequence.
6. Pydraul F-9 is a near neutral fluid and causes no pH effects and is only slightly soluble in water.

I have enclosed a brief outline of the toxicity of this product. If we can answer any further questions, please call on us.
