Allies May Accept Italy Next As Full Partner Against Russ

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Allies were reported today ready to start formal negotiations next month to overhaul Italy's peace treaty and make that nation a full partner against Russia, according to reports from Paris, Nov. 6.

They hope the talks will be well advanced when the United Nations General Assembly meets in Paris, Nov. 24.

According to reliable diplomatic sources the Allies will ask the Assembly to adopt a formal resolution endorsing the treaty revision in the interest of world peace—whether Russia likes it or not.

Decisions on the blueprint for changing the treaty came swiftly.
