The FL chief summed up his testimony today with an appeal for "a restoration of the relationships between prices and wages which existed September 15, 1942" and made these other requests:

"(1) Extension of the price control act without change for two years after the war.

"(2) Congressional support of increased appropriations for effective enforcement of price and rent control.

"(3) Provision of subsidies essential to continue price stability of key cost of living commodities."

War Food Administrator Marvin Jones simultaneously told the house banking committee, holding hearings on the same subject, that the stabilization "line has been held" and that the price control act should be renewed without changes.
