Dear Sirs:-

Sometime ago I believe your company put out a circular about method of handling Ethyl gasoline to prevent poisoning to station men who might get some of this gasoline on an open cut. I believe in this letter you stated that in cases of this kind, the employee should see your company physician, which you maintained in each territory.

We have a case of an employee at my station who has two cut fingers and for some reason they do not want to heal up although he has been to a Doctor. Now it is possible that he might have got some ethyl gasoline on these cut as we have had trouble with the gasoline pump losing its prime and it was sometimes necessary to work on the pump for as much as 30 minutes trying to get the pump primed and during these operations, it is quite possible that some ethyl might have got on his hand.

Please let me know what you think I should do about this and whether you have a Doscov in this territory.
