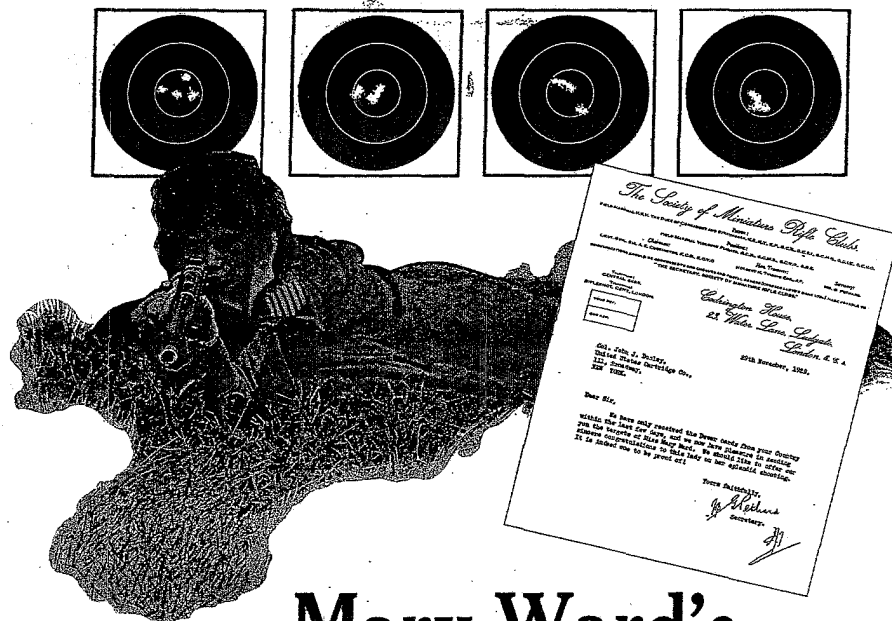




Mary Ward's Dewar Targets

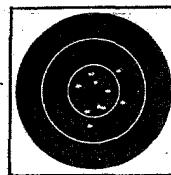
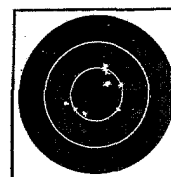
