This is to confirm our telephone conversation of July 10th.

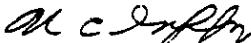
In the letter of July 27th, Mr. R. L. Johnson our Plant Superintendent inadvertently left off an employee who had a blood lead of 50.

Yesterday, July 2, I had a good telephone conversation with Dr. Robert Boyd of the Clearing Industrial Clinic about our medical procedures under the Variance we have been granted. I believe that Dr. Boyd now has a clearer understanding of our and OSHA's needs. In fact, I think his letters of February 8 to you permitting continuation at work of Anderson & Maye were entirely satisfactory. For further explanation I am sending Dr. Boyd some extracts from the OSHA Lead Standard of 1982 (medical surveillance) and a copy of OSHA's letter to our attorney, William Hall, of September 2, 1983.

As neither I nor Dr. Boyd have ever visited your plant, I should like to do so myself, sometime this summer, and if you agree, I should like Dr. Boyd to be invited to visit the plant at the same time. I was rather shocked that he had no knowledge of what we made there, or of the nature of our lead exposures. All he knew was that you belong to the Polymers Division, from your stationery.

I will be in touch with you towards the end of the month to set up such a visit.
