Sorry I missed seeing you when you were in Cleveland. I talked to Vessy on Saturday and there was not much we could stir up between us. We both seemed to be opposed to the report of the committee. I suggested to Vessy that I would write a letter to the Chairman and I am sending you herewith a copy of this letter. Perhaps in Chicago you might discuss the question with someone in authority in the National Safety Council and in this connection I will add that The Ohio Brass Co. has never been unmindful of the accident prevention and health promotion and incidentally the Ohio Brass Company won the National Safety Award for their accident record in the class in which we belong for the period just passed. This award was made in Chicago at the National Safety Congress during October 1931.

I think the recommendations of the committee are entirely too drastic and much more severe than is necessary. The fact of the matter is that the committee does not know except by hearsay what is necessary.
