Dear Dr. Kehoe:

In a chapter on Lead in a text book of pharmacology and therapeutics being written by Dr. Gilman and myself, we have drawn heavily on your data published in various articles in the Journal of Industrial Hygiene, 15, 1933. May we have permission to utilize Table 10 on page 316 of this volume, and Figure 1 on page 317? We would like to redraw Figure 1 after enlargement and to change slightly the arrangement of the lettering so as to make the figure somewhat more clear and less crowded. The details of the data in the figure, of course, will be scrupulously observed. May I also have your consent to quote you verbatim as follows: on page 334, starting with the last sentence in the first column: "The diagnosis of lead" to the end of the paragraph with the concluding words "..... in favor of analytical procedures".
