Dear Dr. Kehoe:

I have just returned from Miami and would like to report to you that the [REDACTED] case has been settled. The total settlement was \$4,000, \$3,000 of which was paid by the Maryland Casualty Company and \$1,000 as a contribution by Ethyl Gasoline Corporation. As a result of the settlement, Hubbard's widow has executed a release to Orange State Oil Company, Ethyl Gasoline Corporation and any and all other persons interested, from any liability arising from the death of her husband, [REDACTED]. Her claim before the Florida Industrial Commission has been withdrawn and a mutual release effected between Orange State Oil Company, Maryland Casualty Company and Ethyl Gasoline Corporation. Mrs. [REDACTED] attorney has subscribed his written approval to the release. Of the \$4,000 paid, Mrs. [REDACTED] received \$3,500 and her attorney \$500.

Everyone seems to be satisfied with this settlement and relations very friendly between the representatives of the Maryland Casualty, Orange State and Ethyl.

While I was in Miami, I made inquiries as to whether or not anything had been heard from any other persons involved in the tank cleaning. I was told that nothing had been heard and that they did not expect any other action in this connection.
