Dear Mr. Young:

Thank you for your letter of April 14, 1972 requesting information on asbestos content of the products we supply you. We have analyzed our sales figures and have found we have supplied 15 different products to you over the last five years. The following tabulation summarizes those products and the asbestos content of each.

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Quigley does not use any asbestos or asbestos packaging materials in shipping any of our products.

Please note that only two of the fifteen products contain asbestos.

Being a manufacturer of refractories and insulations we have been aware of the asbestos situation for some time and accordingly we started our research efforts on asbestos free products long before the OSHA Standards were issued. Our efforts have been successful, and we have been marketing our new non-asbestos 1800°F insulation "Panelex" which is available as a castable or in block form. Panelex is now being used as a direct substitute for our asbestos based insulation "Panelag". Although we have not as yet developed the direct substitute for Insulag, Panelex in many instances will be quite satisfactory. However, each application has to be considered separately and your Quigley salesman should be consulted. In the meantime we are working on a direct substitute for Insulag and are hopeful it will be available soon.

I hope the above has supplied the information you have requested. However if it doesn't or if we can be of any further assistance in any way please feel free to call upon us.

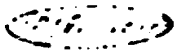
