Our Type 25 Thermal Insulating Tape can be treated to be "lint free." The wet weaving of the jacket would be beneficial. The more preferred way would be to treat the jacket with a resin hinder.

I think that "lint free" asbestos lagging products will be necessary in the years ahead. I related several months ago that the English are already starting a program to treat all lagging cloth, also to introduce wet woven cloths in as many applications as possible. Where the wet woven appearance is undesirable, brushing will be necessary. If the lagging is torn instead of cut asbestos dust would possibly reach a high concentration in close quarters.

We will make up a footage of #25 Insulating Tape for Mr. Ahern to present to this customer.
