2 exposure.

3 Therefore, it is incumbent on all employers
4 whose workers handle or come in contact with asbestos-
5 containing materials to provide some kind of
6 instruction or training to educate the workers
7 concerning potential hazards and means of avoiding
8 them wherever possible.
