Of the products we sold to you in the past year, only one, 830-5005 Gray Primer, has a solvent system which conforms to Rule 501 of the Illinois Pollution Control Board proposed Rules and Regulations.

According to the proposed regulations, a solvent system can contain no more than 5% Class 1, 8% Class 2, and 20% Class 3 solvent. Listed below are the Du Pont products used by Litho-Strip Corporation and the volume percent of each class of solvent based on the total volume of solvent:
