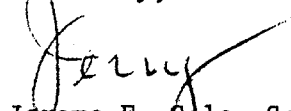
Thank you very much for your letter of February 13th. Frankly, I had more or less forgotten about my letter of April 9th to Dr. Suskind concerning Dr. Hammond, but I am, of course, pleased that you did not take exception to the opinion that I expressed. I have been disappointed that the Kettering Laboratory has seemed to leave the field of expertise which had been built up over the years and Dr. Hammond's letter to the EPA seemed to me to be the last straw. Quite frankly, I have been impressed by some of the more recent things that Dr. Hammond has written and perhaps my criticism of him was a bit premature.
