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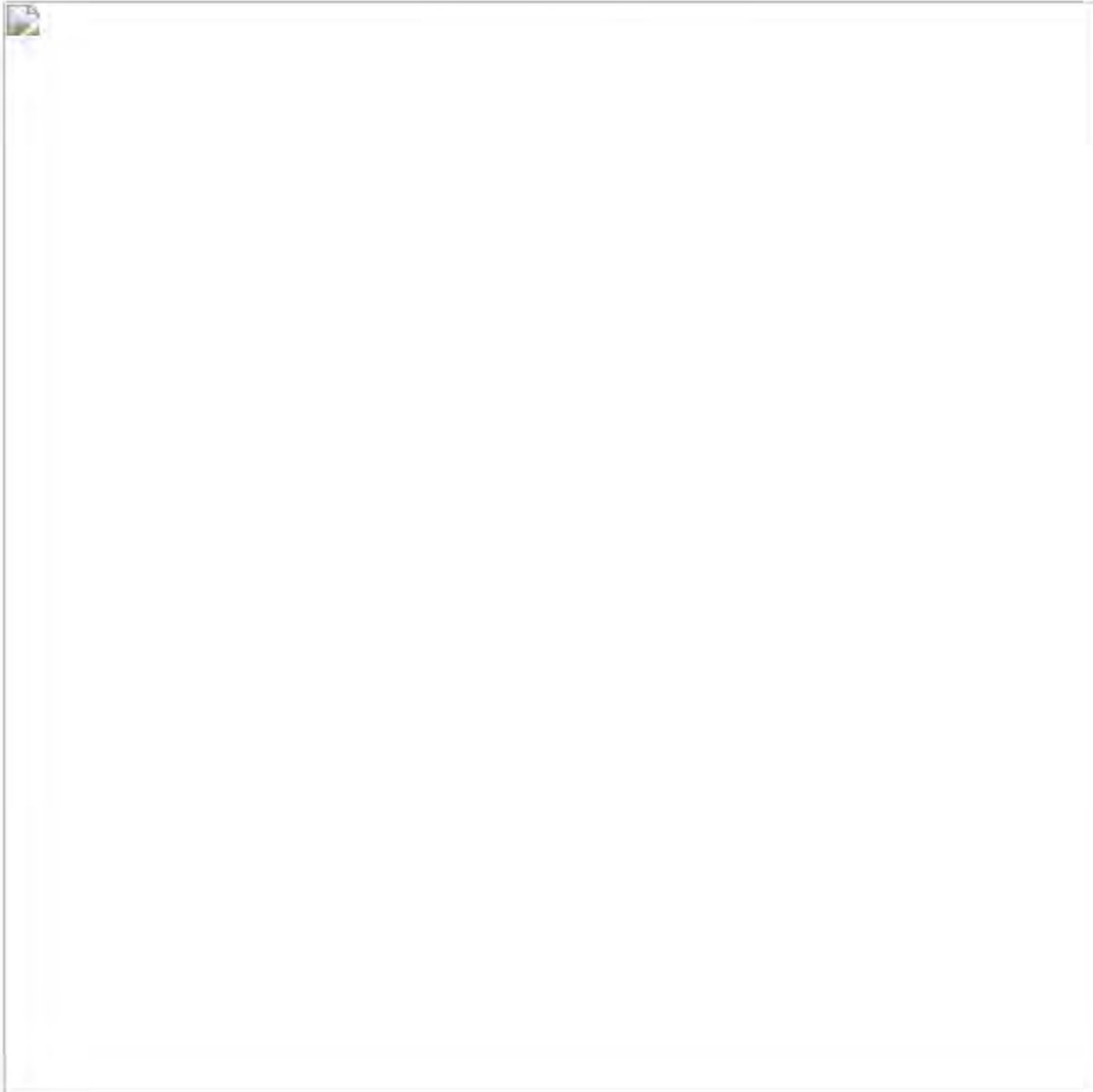

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attendees, and enjoyed food and beverages from western states prior to the State of the Union.



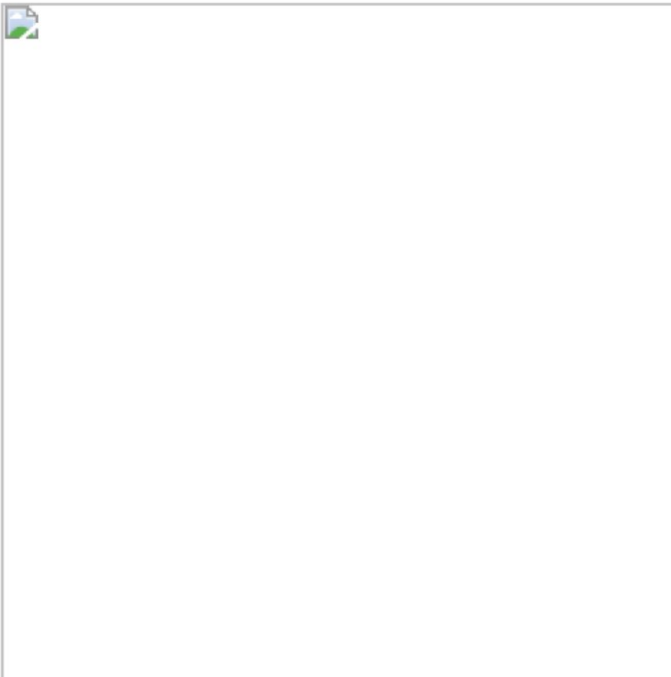

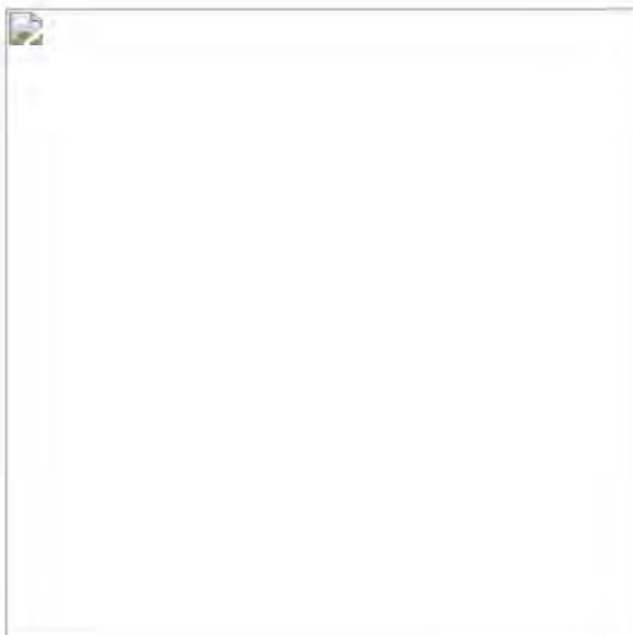
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Holtz-Eakin taught staffers about ways they could enrich the economy of their state through subtle changes. And those changes in the long run would create advancement in all policy areas of the West.

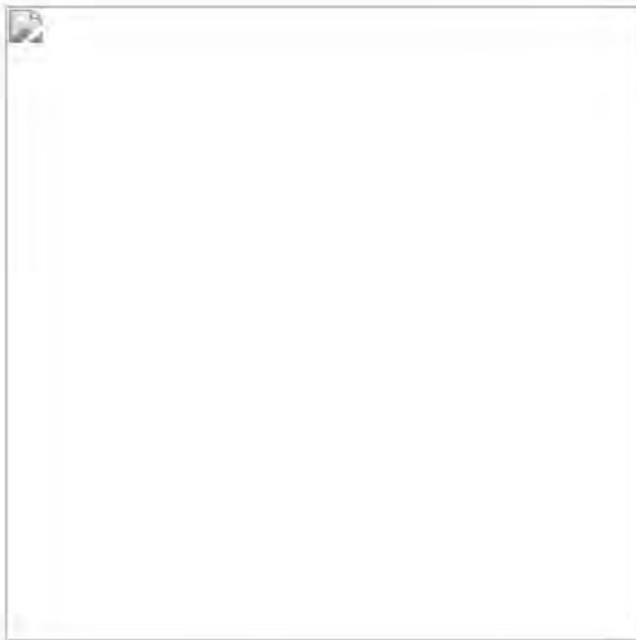
Arizona Trip: Western Policy Roundtable--March 9-11, 2018
