Dear Mrs. Agnew:

The work which is being carried out in the Laboratory is no longer supported by N.I.H. funds. This was terminated last November 1967. The work still goes on with the support of the original industrial sponsors.

I would not consent to any account of this work, or of any publicity, as being under the sponsorship of N.I.H. Neither is there any useful purpose to be served by publicizing the work at this time. There may be some fireworks at the time of its publication, and if so, that would be the time for publicity, but not for its initiation here.

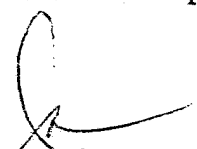

Our contact in the Features Section of the National Institutes of Health has asked us to suggest ideas for picture stories about our NIH-supported research.
