RE: ASBESTOS

Dear Mr. Santiago:

As a roofer, the likelihood of you coming in contact with shingles containing asbestos fibers in their construction is very remote. All residential roofs covered with shingles during the 1970's and 1980's are free of asbestos fibers.

On commercial roofs where the architect specified a Class A shingle during the 1960 - 1970 era, it is possible that a shingle contains a very small amount of asbestos fibers entrapped in its asphalt coating. Bird needs two shingle samples from the roof in question as well as a copy of the architect's specification before we can make our recommendations to you.
