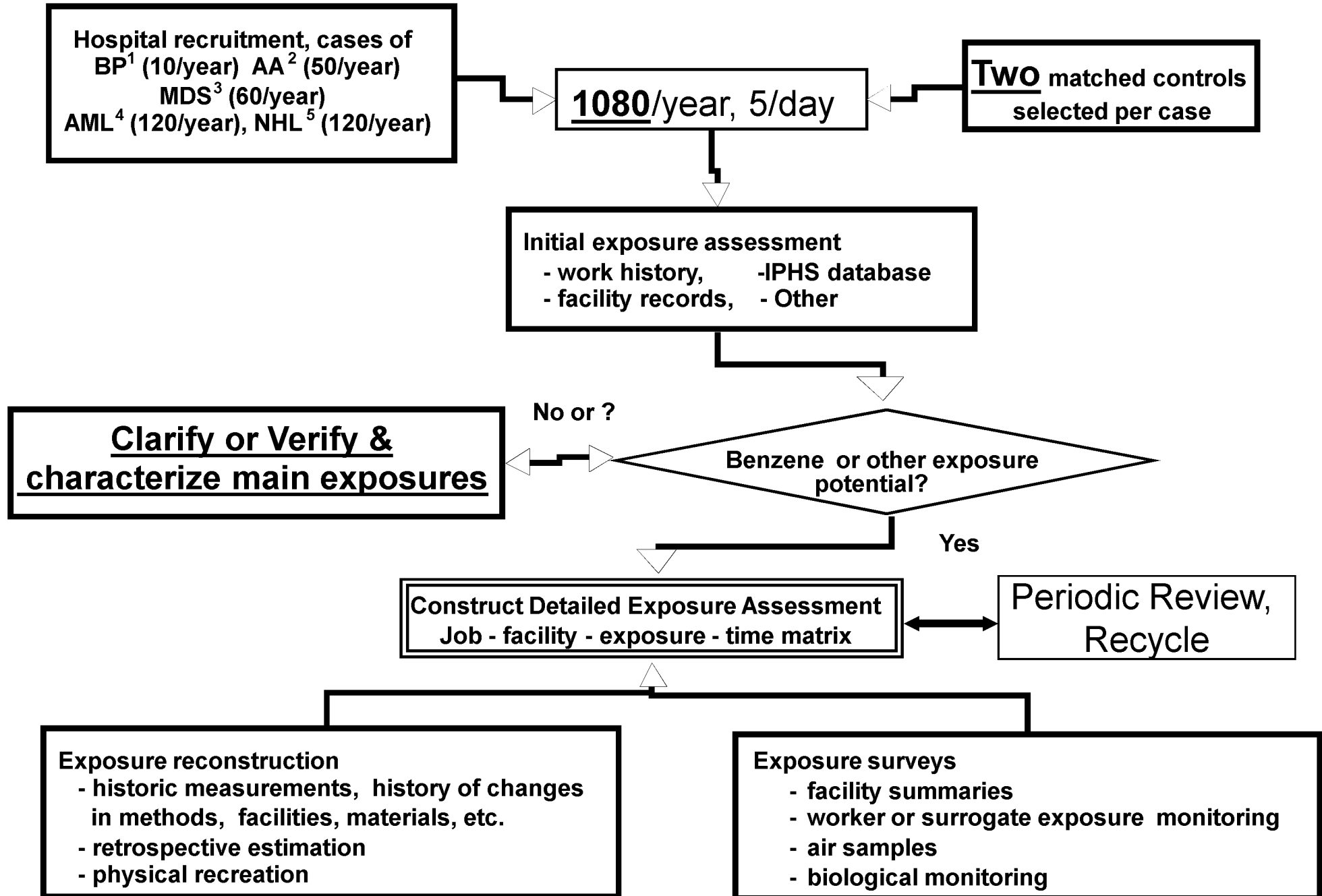

Shanghai Health Study

Current status of studies

- Study began accruing cases in July 2003 – meeting expected case targets: 26 hospitals participating
 - Cases versus expectations as of December 2003:
BP (0 vs.10/yr), AA (17 vs. 50/yr), MDS (26 vs. 60/yr), AML (42 vs. 100/yr), NHL (66 vs. 120/yr). Diagnosis of laboratory versus secondary pathology review high, > 90 %.
- Investigators considering protocol revisions, with scientific review, both University Institutional and Consortium Science Review Panel (SRP). Exposure assessment a current focus of the SRP.
- Process underway to replace chair of Ethics Review Panel . Seeking new US member along with current members (China and EU).

Shanghai Health Study

Program Management

- Budget planning
 - Budget revised to meet new funding level, \$21.08M
 - Quarterly financial report format expanded to include study milestones (cases accrued).
 - Investigators working on reporting costs and cost projections based on accrual rates for improving spending rate estimates.
 - Current budget spending projections suggest additional consortium member payments not required until 2005 or perhaps 2006 (to be clarified by 2Q04).
- Contract reviews completed
- API-BHRC contract currently being revised
- External Stakeholders Engagement
 - Consortium meeting - April 2004.

Shanghai Health Study

Communication and Outreach

- First Annual Meeting was a success
- Launch event celebrating completion and start up of the laboratory – December 2003
- Stakeholder Engagement discussions to begin
- Next annual meeting – August 2004
- Annual meeting in Shanghai - Nov 2005

Shanghai Health Study

Communication and outreach

- Stakeholder Engagement discussions
Beginning discussions identified a broader range of intentions of consortium members than anticipated. Next meeting in late April 2004 to align intentions and/or reach understanding.

Shanghai Health Study

Communication and outreach

- Shell intentions to be based on:
 - Protecting reputation – in China and around the world.
 - Protect relationships/investments in China.
 - Meet commitment to transparency and ethics.
 - Protect credibility of project and participants.
 - Raise awareness and understanding of the project.
 - Secure buy-in and constructive feedback into the process.

Shell Activities

- Comprehensive Shell internal communication plan has been drafted, includes:
 - Global Shell engagement on regular basis
 - Quarterly updates
 - Issues management process
 - Ongoing connection to Shell China external affairs team.
 - E-news (on a quarterly basis).

- Opportunities for enhanced outreach and communication:
 - Shell currently holding consortium leadership positions:
 - Patsy Clegg - consortium oversight committee Chair
 - Stuart Cagen - technical committee Vice-Chair and Chair of finance committee

- Shanghai Benzene Study contributes to a larger global benzene industry research effort:
 - Benzene Symposium – Munich, Germany - October 2004
 - CONCAWE benzene epidemiology meta-analysis - ongoing.
