Dear Dr. Kehoe:-

Your letter of May 4th has been given careful consideration by Mr. Fasig and his associates during my absence from the city, and I now have before me their recommendation which is for a modification of your proposition in that they suggest a reduction in the number of men to be examined of from 35 to 20, and a further reduction in the number of dust counts to be made from approximately 40 to approximately 20. These changes with a possible reduction in the number of X-Rays to be taken reduces the figure that you suggest from \$1900 to a figure close to \$1300.

In making these suggestions we wish to make very plain to you that we have no disposition to bring about a situation in which you and your associates might make some actual contribution of your time and effort without adequate compensation therefor. Our position is that we believe this lesser amount of work which we suggest will still be ample to enable you to determine pretty well the hygienic conditions in our plant, and will certainly put you in a position to tell us whether in your judgment more work should be done or whether what we suggest will be sufficient.

If after reading these suggestions of ours you believe that the amount of work mentioned will be inadequate to enable you to reach any definite conclusions, we want you to have no hesitation in frankly stating your convictions. While we do not wish to make any larger expenditure than may be required, we at the same time do not want to handicap you to the extent that you will not be able to give us a report that will fairly represent our actual conditions.
