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Indiana has proposed an amendment to its air pollution regulations which would limit hydrocarbon emissions to 15 lbs./day. Du Pont, the NPCA, and others presented testimony at the July 7th public hearing. Du Pont's testimony pointed out that the regulation, if adopted, would stop all industrial painting in the state. Regulations patterned after Ohio's regulations were suggested as an alternate. The EPA has already approved Ohio's regulations.

J. L. Parsons, Engineering Department; R. E. Austin, Legal; and E. E. Swain, Jr., F. & F. plan to visit Mr. ^{Don} Goodwin of the EPA on July 10th. Mr. Goodwin is in charge of writing the regulations that EPA has proposed for several states recently, (ex., Louisiana, Tennessee, Texas). These proposed regulations are much more stringent than those already approved by the EPA in other states.

We hope to persuade Mr. Goodwin that the objectives of cleaner air can be met without imposing industry crippling regulations and that Rule 66 type regulations will do the job for hydrocarbons.
