Dear Jack:

Thanks very much for your letter of March 3, concerning program material for the meeting of the American Industrial Hygiene Association, in St. Louis. Unfortunately, I am not quite sure that I understood it, and I am writing to clarify one point. Dr. Deichmann would be very glad to present his portion of the double-barrel title which I gave you, while Dr. Heyroth is very pleased to withdraw his title, feeling that it will be better to present the subject at a later date. It would be my interpretation of your letter that you do not need either of the papers I mentioned as being available, to fill up your program. On the other hand, it is possible that you meant to take these two titles, while suggesting it would be unnecessary for us to dig any deeper into the barrel. In any case, I suggest that the paper by Heyroth be withdrawn, but that if you have room for it, the one by Deichmann, "The Toxicity of Certain Chemicals Used in the Manufacture of Sulfonamides - 2-Aminothiazole," be included. If for any reason you prefer not to make use of it, please do not hesitate to say so, for actually it is not a matter of importance to me whether this is given or not. We shall make no effort to get together papers on any of the other problems we are working with at the present time.

If you have no time to write me, just scribble a note on the bottom of this letter and forward it to me for information, at your convenience.
