Dear Bob:

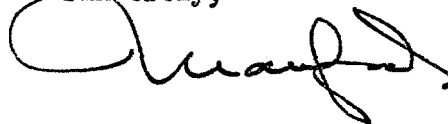
The copy of my letter to you of July 16th which went to him has brought from Tom Shipman the letter of which a copy is herewith.
