> We would like to discuss the project among relevant industry groups and other key organizations:

> > We would like to make this an agenda item at a future CONCAWE meeting - hopefully in the September time frame.

> > We would also like to discuss this amongst Bz producers. Would the APA be the relevant group? Would it be beneficial to discuss it with any other groups at ECETOC or CEFIC? Would either of you be willing to coordinate?

> > We'd also like to discuss possible roles for WHO/IPCS, IARC and ILO. We have an ILO contact, and Michale Bird will likely be able to help us with IARC, but do either of you have any recommendations for entry into WHO/IPCS?

> If either of you have any other suggestions on possible stakeholders, we'd value this input very much.

> We'd also value your opinion on whether the PI's (Irons and Wong) ought to be part of the discussions. Our preliminary thought was that they weren't essential at the industry meetings, but they might be more critical for the IARC and IPCS interfaces. Any thoughts on this?
