3 continue to increase for a period of time because of
4 the exposures that occurred 20 years ago.

5 Q So in 1950s and '60s you really weren't
6 seeing much of it, because the people who were
7 exposed, to a great extent, were people who were
8 working around World War II in the shipyards and
9 things like that?

10 Is that what you are saying?

11 A In the 1950s there were not as many cases of
12 mesothelioma reported because the levels of exposure
13 in the 1920s and 1930s were not as great.
