Dear Mr. Webber:

Immediately following our conference with you and Dr. Rees on July 22nd, I visited Mr. [REDACTED] at the Good Samaritan Hospital and examined him in company with Dr. Rees.

Mr. [REDACTED] is suffering from a generalized dermatitis, most marked on the face and torso. There was nothing evident in his condition which would point towards any specific causative agent, so that our diagnosis for the time being must rest as that of acute dermatitis of unknown origin.

From the history and present picture, one feels that this man's condition is due to a sensitivity to some material with which he has contact. In order to establish a correct diagnosis and recommend treatment, I feel that we should have Mr. [REDACTED] here at the laboratory for a day or so after his present lesion has cleared up. We can then skin test him with a variety of substances which are likely to produce a dermatitis and possibly arrive at an exact diagnosis.

If you will communicate with us after Mr. Miller is well, we will arrange to carry out the above procedures.
