Dear Bill,

While in Norfolk last Saturday I again contacted Dr. Woods and Mr. Alverson of the insurance company and I am giving below just what they had to say.

Statement by Dr. Woods -

██████████ is coming along very well and has had no flare up in over two weeks. They have him working around the ward waiting on and helping other patients. Dr. Woods believes it best to keep him in the hospital for at least a couple of weeks more in order to build up his hemoglobin, he feels that if they release him they may not be able to get him to the office for treatments. A short time ago the count was down to 49 and they now have it up to 60.

Statement by Mr. Alverson -

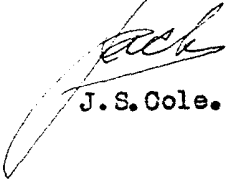
and finding everything OK and his reports showing the same as mine had I think he better use discretion in his accusations or they may bounce and strike back.
