

1 A Willis G. Hazard, we called him Bill Hazard.

2 Oh, I think it was probably in the early '40s.

3 Q Can you tell us the circumstances under
4 which you met him?

5 A Bill Hazard was a graduate of the Harvard
6 School of Public Health. He was an industrial
7 hygienist, and he was on the staff of the personnel
8 department of Owens-Illinois which was headed by
9 Milton Olander.

10 He was a specialist in industrial hygiene,
11 of course, as his background indicates.

12 Now, you are asking me what circumstances.
13 And when I joined Owens-Corning, Mr. Boeschenstein
14 said, you better get over and meet some of those
15 people at Owens-Illinois, especially in Bill Olander's
16 department, and see how they function and what their
17 points of view are and so on, and this I did.

18 And that is how I happened to meet him, as
19 well as several others that were on Olander's staff.

20 Q When did you first become aware of the
21 entity known as asbestosis?
