Dear Mr. Bond:

Our activities and services were discussed with Dr. Rankin, Mr. Heck and Mr. Lorio last week and I plan to make a survey of your plant in the near future.

In such a survey we note the potential health hazards the control methods in use, and collect atmospheric samples to determine the amount of contaminant present. The sampling is frequently omitted when the control measures are obviously adequate.

No specific date can be set at present but I would like to obtain the necessary clearances to avoid later delays.
