Memorandum and Comments

I am returning your complete file on this subject which you so kindly loaned me. Early last week, I was in Eastern Kentucky in our official program with Dr. Smith and discussed the current on. I believe this will indicate that there was a definite increase in the number of persons who were exposed to the atomic bomb. However, it should be noted that these persons were not from Kentucky. I would greatly appreciate having such as will receive the copy of this final report.

Because the results of this survey are rather preliminary, we are considering a further research project which will include the systematic study of our original survey program. I think that we should have a real survey of exposed and non-exposed people in the various areas where exposure to the atomic bomb occurred. We must realize that because the purpose of this survey is to determine the health of the atomic bomb victims, it is essential that the results be as accurate as possible. I would like to see a final report on this survey.
