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Two AT&T Units Get \$199,125,000 Contract For Nike-Zeus Missile

Western Electric, Bell Labs, Subcontractors Listed; Raytheon Gets \$29,597,525 Order

WASHINGTON—Western Electric Co., Burlington, N.C., and Bell Telephone Laboratories, Whippany, N.J., were given a \$199,125,000 Army contract for research and development of the Nike-Zeus anti-missile missile. Both companies are subsidiaries of American Telephone & Telegraph Corp.

The Nike-Zeus, in the "advanced development" stage, is for defense against intercontinental ballistic missiles. The contract includes funds for installation and testing at Whippany and at White Sands Proving Grounds in New Mexico.

The army listed these principal subcontractors:

Douglas Aircraft Corp., Santa Monica, Calif.; Sperry Gyroscope Co., Great Neck, N.Y.; Goodyear Aircraft Co., Akron; Remington Rand Univac division, St. Paul; Continental Electronics, Dallas; Continental Can Co., Coffeyville, Kan.; Texas Instruments Co., Dallas, and New Mexico State University, Las Cruces.

The Navy announced award of contracts for propulsion machinery for eight nuclear-powered submarines to General Electric Co., Westinghouse Electric Corp., and Delaval Steam Turbine Co.

GE, at Lynn, Mass., received a contract totaling \$9,294,465; Westinghouse, at Essington and Pittsburgh, Pa., \$4,845,000, and Delaval, at Trenton, N.J., \$4,847,510. Under these contracts, the Navy said, the companies will supply turbo-generators and other gear for the nuclear subs.

In other contracting activity, the Army gave Martin Co., Orlando, Fla., a \$10 million award for research and development on the Pershing battlefield missile. The service also awarded Firestone Tire and Rubber Co., Akron, a \$5,533,789 contract for gas masks, on which work will be performed at Fall River, Mass.

WALTHAM, Mass.—Raytheon Co. has received contracts totaling \$29,597,525 from the Boston Ordnance District for continued production and engineering services on the Hawk missile system.

Raytheon is prime contractor for the Hawk, surface-to-air missile, operational with both the U.S. Army and Marine Corps.

Work will be carried out at Raytheon's missile system facilities in Andover, Lowell, North Dighton, Waltham and Wayland, Mass.; Oxnard, Calif.; and Bristol, Tenn.

Raytheon also received a Navy contract in excess of \$1,500,000 for 12 air-transportable harbor surveillance radar and communications systems. The contract includes spare parts, Raytheon's Model 1600 radars and various units of microwave communications and radar relay equipment. The systems are scheduled for delivery over the next 15 months.

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
