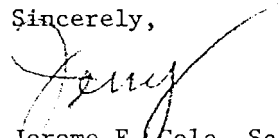

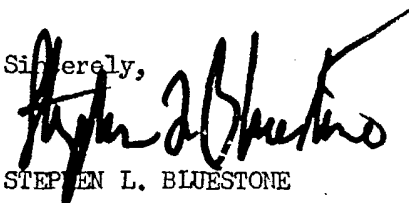
Dear Mr. Carr:
