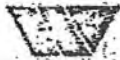

SUBJECT: Contact with Department of Labor Inspector

WARNING

If an employer is seeking guidance and consultations from a federal inspector, he should do it by letter or telephone and not invite the inspector to come to his place of business to make a courtesy inspection of his workplace because if the inspector sees violations, he is required to issue citations, order abatement and propose penalties in some instances. We have been advised that photographs, drawings, or sketches may be presented to the inspector for his suggestions at his office without danger of citations, abatement orders and proposed penalties.
