'Fair Share' Chest Gift Plan Developed at Parley

A yardstick for measuring a "fair share" gift to the Community Chest was produced at a training meeting for 200 chest workers yesterday at the Lafayette Hotel.

The "fair share" gift is equal to one day's pay or 1 per cent of a person's income if he earns more than \$5000 a year, David Beaman, campaign vice chairman, and Dr. Orville Cole, chairman of the Chest Speaker's Bureau, said.

Dr. Cole reminded workers that the Chest's goal this year is \$546,922. Beaman introduced Glenn Snyder, head of agency personnel from the Red Feather agencies. Division generals presented were:

Couple's Dream of Settling Down on Island Shattered

SYDNEY, Australia, Sept. 12 (UPI). An American couple's dream of settling down on a peaceful little island was shattered today after their small boat ran aground on a reef 400 miles northeast of here.

Byron Tanner and his wife, Dorothy, had, sailed their 38-foot ketch here from Honolulu last December.

After spending eight months here they started out for Tahiti Sept. 2.

They were given a colorful farewell by grass-skirted Polynesian dancers and Hawaiian guitar players.

Before leaving, Tanner said that "We intend looking for a little island where we can settle after we've finished traveling—then we can live in peace. The world's in such a mess we want to get away from it for awhile."

Wilton Caterer to Speak at 'Gentlemen Chefs' Luncheon

Ernest Glaser, catering manager for the Wilton Hotel, will attempt to convince members of the Gentlemen Chefs Assn. that United States cooking is superior to European culinary skill at a luncheon today in Beverly Hills.

"It is quite an honor for me to be invited to speak to the group," Glaser said yesterday. "Last month's speaker was Duncan Hines."

Glaser, a native of France, claims top culinary secrets are

handed down on the European continent only during dramatic deathbed scenes.

"Everyone keeps their recipes a secret," he asserted. "On the other hand," he added, "top chefs from all over Europe make their secrets known to every American housewife via radio, newspapers and television, as soon as they arrive here. This is the land where they all want to live."

Glaser pointed out that since basically food here is superior to the continental variety, unless you plan to spend large sums for every meal, you will find better restaurant food in this country than in Europe. Provided, he added, you choose outstanding, but not necessarily high-priced, dining spots here which specialize in certain dishes.

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
