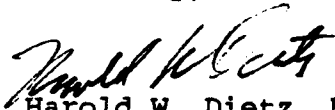
Dear Dr. Bennett:

I am returning the form confirming my address and taking this opportunity to answer two other questions.

I have been unable to obtain any further information on the work history of S. Steele of our Niagara (Canada) Plant except to confirm that he had high exposure to VCM as a poly cleaner prior to 1970 and the time from first exposure to diagnosis appears to be in excess of 30 years. Dr. Tamburro who had the tissue section reviewed at the University of Louisville stated that he considered the pathological picture typical of workers who have had early very high exposures sufficient to cause liver damage and scarring with a subsequent, related, long delayed appearance of angiosarcoma.

I do not believe that it will be possible for me to join you at your meeting with Dr. Shah in Washington, D. C. in September. I regret that we apparently will not have the opportunity to renew our acquaintance during your projected visit.
