Dear Mr. Marino:

I have reviewed the information submitted with your letter of March 8, 1974 concerning your company's request for approval of the use of the non-asbestos bearing Panelex insulating material. Based on the data submitted a request by a licensed contractor for use of this material would be acceptable under the conditions described below. Any derivatives of this material having the same or similar mineral constituents (non-asbestos bearing) will be approved upon submission of an analysis for our records.

The application of this material by "spray-on" methods to surfaces directly exposed to the outside atmosphere or any other situation where fugitive dust may be generated must be performed by a company or contractor having a current operating license issued by this agency. Guidelines for application are as follows:

1. All mixing and spraying areas must be completely enclosed.
2. All mixing and spraying areas must be sweep clean afterwards with all refuse placed in sealed containers.
3. Workmen must wear respirators.
