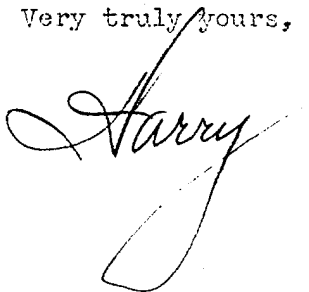
Mr. Benner and his associates would like an expression from our Medical Department as to just how long these spells may continue and whether or not we feel the fact that they still occur, is serious.
