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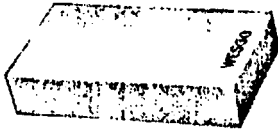
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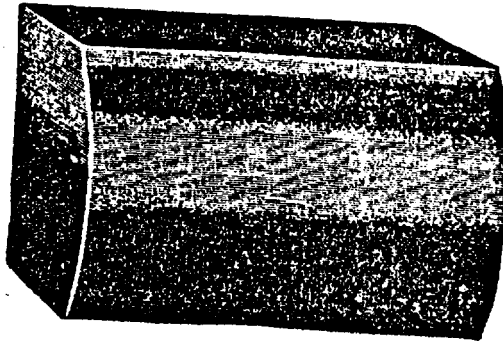
SOLDERING BLOCKS



WESGO SOLDERING BLOCK

Due to its durability, cleanliness and non-cracking, non-burning properties, the Wesgo has been enthusiastically received by the manufacturing jewelers. Made of the Wesgo Super Refractory, instead of charcoal, this block will last indefinitely. The block is $3\frac{3}{4}$ inches long, $2\frac{1}{8}$ inches wide and approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ inch thick. The top side is smooth and absolutely flat.

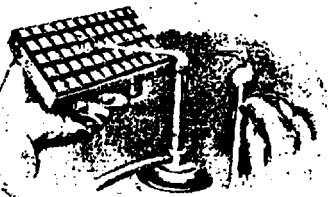

CHARCOAL SOLDERING BLOCK

Quick, sure and convenient soldering depends much upon the soldering block. These are chemically prepared and superior to other types. The advantages of a charcoal block are many. They retain heat longer than other kinds and are easily punctured, thereby holding the work firmly. Supplied in four sizes.

CORRUGATED ASBESTOS SOLDERING BLOCK

Corrugated soldering blocks have the advantage over other types in that the heat can readily pass around the part to be soldered without moving the article—this also makes binding unnecessary. This type of block is practical for annealing and will save the surfaces of work benches.

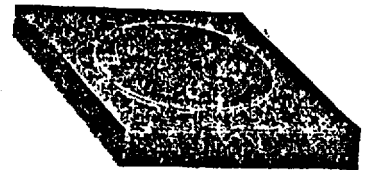

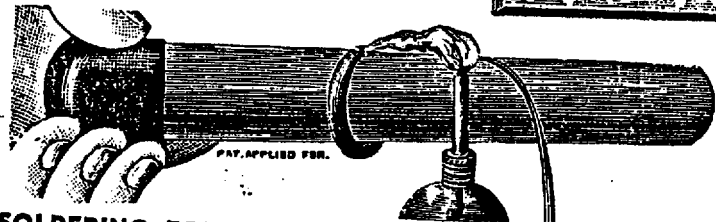

ASBESTOS SOLDERING PAD
