When you have obtained a formulation for a White
Baking Enamel for use as a Toilet Seat Enamel, I would like
to review it with Haskell Laboratory.

As a developmental guideline, I would ask you to
avoid use of any heavy metal containing materials, particularly
lead containing pigments. Isocyanates and epoxides, if used, should
be completely reacted so that no residual monomer is present.
