Dear Mr. Jones:

Since writing you on May 24th, my associate Dr. Schradin saw your employee - Mr. [REDACTED] - in Pittsburgh, talked with him and examined him.

I have no doubt you have various reports resulting from the examination of Mr. [REDACTED] in Pittsburgh by other doctors, and it seems scarcely necessary at this time to send the report of Dr. Schradin's examination. However it does seem useful to let you know that in Dr. Schradin's opinion, there was no evidence of either a history of significant exposure or of physical findings suggestive of lead poisoning.

I shall be very much interested in knowing the outcome of Mr. [REDACTED] examination in the Windber Hospital, and particularly in the results of any analyses which might have been made on the blood and spinal fluid and excreta. Moreover if I can be of any further assistance to you, in line with the suggestions in my letter of May 24th, please let me know.
