BIOGRAPHY

Henry G. Sidford

BORN in Brooklyn, N. Y., on February 20, 1875, Henry G. Sidford started his business career on August 1, 1889, when he secured the position of office boy with the Atlantic White Lead Company, which later became part of the National Lead Company.

His earlier years of service with the Company brought him through many departments of the business. This, in later years, proved to be of great value to him. Mr. Sidford held the position of Assistant Comptroller of the Atlantic Branch until 1922, when he was made Assistant Manager. During this period he was in charge of white-lead sales for the branch. In 1926 he was appointed Manager and in this same year, he became a director of the National Lead Company. Mr. Sidford had the distinction of becoming a Vice-President of the Company in January, 1939, which office he now holds.

Mr. Sidford's knowledge of the Company's business has not been gained entirely from his Atlantic Branch experience. He has added to his store of information by visiting other branches of the Company. He has also been to England, France and Germany where he became acquainted with National Lead Company interests in those countries.

His many friends agree that Mr. Sidford's business acumen is only exceeded by his genial personality.

BIOGRAPHY

Haywood P. Cavarly

HAYWOOD P. CAVARLY was born in Raleigh, North Carolina, on January 16, 1872. He entered the employ of the Atlantic White Lead Company on January 2, 1890, doing office routine until the summer of 1891 when he was placed in the Laboratory under the supervision of Dr. G. W. Thompson.

For seven years Mr. Cavarly was occupied with laboratory work until his appointment as Assistant Superintendent of the Atlantic Works. A short time later, he was made Superintendent of the plant and in 1912 he became General Superintendent of all plants of the Atlantic Branch. In May, 1923, Mr. Cavarly was appointed Assistant Branch Manager and came to the Company's New York Office, where he continues to look after the manufacturing end of the business.

Much credit is due Mr. Cavarly for his interest in the welfare of the people associated with him. It was Mr. Cavarly who organized and guided the affairs of the Atlantic Branch Sick Benefit Association, which has enjoyed thirty-five years of successful administration. Another example of Mr. Cavarly's foresight is the Atlantic Branch Christmas Fund, which has grown steadily for twenty-six years. Both these activities owe their existence and success to the ideas and ability of Mr. Cavarly.
