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I. Summary of Results

In 1970 an estimated 4.5 million persons were living within five miles of plants currently producing vinyl chloride or vinyl chloride resins. Of these, 4.3 million were living in census-tracted areas, that is, in or in the environs of cities which generally had a population of 50,000 or more. The remainder resided in or near smaller places.

Data available from the 1970 Census of Population for the tracted areas permitted estimates to be prepared of those persons living within four zones around the plants. The outer limit - 5 miles - was chosen because previous studies of emission levels were limited to this or lesser distances. The zones shown permit a choice in the distance from the source. The estimated number of persons living at the various distances from the plants are as follows:

0 to 1/4 mile	37,000
1/4 to 1 mile	197,000
1 to 3 miles	1,506,000

No data are presented on the number of workers employed by the plants. Some of the workers, however, would be expected to live in proximity to the plant in which they are employed.

Since April 1970, when the 1970 Census of Population was taken, the population of the United States has increased by about 5 percent. In addition, the U.S. Bureau of the Census has reported that the enumeration missed some 4 million persons. For the Nation, the current population living within the 5-mile radius of the plants is undoubtedly larger than in 1970. Because of varying rates of growth in localities and in portions of the localities, it would be inadvisable to attempt to apply the national adjusted population rates to the figures for any specific plant or combination of plants.

II.A. Source of Plants Surveyed

The Environmental Protection Agency through its Research Triangle Park facility (EPA/RTP) prepared a list of plants for possible inclusion in the survey. The list gave separate listings for producers of ethylene dichloride, vinyl chloride, PVC resins, copolymers and PVC/propylene. Consequently, a single plant could be listed in two or more of these classifications. Every effort was made to verify the listing, to include plants in the industry not listed, and to exclude those which should not be in the survey and those which were no longer producing vinyl chloride or related products.

The initial step in this procedure was to contact trade associations which presumably were in a position to provide this information. Neither the Manufacturing Chemists Association nor the Society of Plastic Industries was able to supply such a list. It was learned from these sources, however, that a private research organization (Tabershaw/Cooper Associates, Berkeley, California), had recently made a survey of vinyl chloride producers. A list of the plants included in this survey was obtained from Tabershaw/Cooper. Fewer plants were identified than in the EPA/RTP list, but it did include the major producers and an additional plant which was added after verification that it fell within the scope of the survey.

Regional offices of the EPA issue permits for waste disposal plants in the industry which do not discharge their wastes into a municipal sewage system. Each regional office with plants under consideration for inclusion in the survey was contacted by telephone and asked for the specific addresses (street and number or as complete a description as possible of the physical location) of the plants for which they had information, if the plants were operating, and if their products fell into the scope of the survey. They were also asked if they knew of any additional plants which should be included.

In addition, telephone conversations were held with respondents in each tract area. The names of these respondents were obtained from the Bureau of the Census. They were usually the directors of regional, county, or city planning boards who participate in the census tract program of the Bureau. Information requested was similar to that requested of the EPA regional offices.

When the inclusion of a plant was doubtful, the management of the plant was contacted by telephone for a determination. Several instances in which the products were known but it was questionable as to whether the plant should be included were referred to the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health for a recommendation.

Information obtained from local sources resulted in the addition of four plants: Borden, Inc., Geismar, Louisiana; Foster Grant Co., Leominster, Massachusetts; and GAF Corporation and Monsanto Co., Texas City, Texas.

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II.B. Sources of Population Data

National population data for small geographic units are available only from the 1970 Census of Population. Although current population estimates have been prepared for some of the tracted areas, the estimates do not provide the detail available from the 1970 census reports. Consequently, the decision was made to use the 1970 census data for all areas, regardless of the existence of later estimates for some areas.

For those plants located in tracted areas, the population estimates are based on census tracts. Census tracts are defined by the Bureau of the Census as "small areas into which large cities and adjacent areas have been divided for statistical purposes." Each tract consists of one or more enumeration districts (E.D.'s) to enable the Bureau of the Census to consolidate data to obtain totals for cities, county units, counties, and other areas. In some, but not all, census-tracted areas, limited information is available for sections as small as one city block.

Published census tract data provide a wealth of data on the demographic, social, and economic characteristics of residents. Such characteristics as race (white, Negro, all other races), age by sex for selected age groups, number of households and household relationships (such as head, wife, other related individual, non-relative of head), are published in the census tract reports. These data are from a 100-percent count of the population.

Data based upon samples are also available for social characteristics such as birthplace of parents, school enrollment, years of school completed, residence in 1965, and labor characteristics. Sample data are also available for males and females on the employment status of the population 16 years old and over, and industry and occupation of employed workers. Information on income, also based upon sample data, provide, for example, income for families and unrelated individuals, and ratio of family income to poverty level.

Data are also published on such housing characteristics as type of occupancy, equipment (plumbing and kitchen facilities), value of owner-occupied units, and contract rent. These data are also available by enumeration districts in unpublished form and may be obtained from the Bureau of the Census.

Data similar to those published for census tracts are also available for county subdivisions. These are the primary units of a county such as a city, village, or town, or census county divisions. These census county divisions are areas defined by the Bureau of the Census for the presentation of data for areas smaller than counties in those counties where the minor civil divisions are not suitable for statistical purposes.

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II.C Estimate Methodology

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The respondents in each tracted area in which plants in the survey were located were also asked for the number of the census tract in which each plant was located. They were requested to draw concentric circles with radii of $\frac{1}{4}$, 1, 3, and 5 miles about each plant and to assign each tract within the 5-mile radius of the plant to one of the four zones.

We asked that the tract numbers be read to us over the telephone and that the worksheets that they used to develop the information be mailed to us later. Some respondents also sent in maps that had been used.

Although many respondents complied fully with our request, some gave only the numbers of the tracts in which the plants were located. Sometimes the information was not usable. In these cases, we made the assignment to the zones from tract maps. These are published in the 1970 Census Tracts, final reports, PHC (1) series. There is a report in the series for each standard metropolitan statistical area for which tracts were delineated for the 1970 census.

The respondents were requested to assign each tract to only one zone, even though it fell into more than one zone. The rule was that the tract was to be assigned to the zone which included the largest proportion of its population. This would lessen the burden on the respondents and on the compilation of the age and sex data and, assuming that the misassignment of parts of the tracts would tend to average out, give about the same results as splitting tracts. We asked the local respondents to make the assignment to zones because they would have better knowledge of the distribution of the population within the tracts. When we made the assignments, we assumed an even distribution of the population within the tracts and placed each tract in the zone in which the largest part of its area lay.

Definition of the areas by enumeration district rather than by tracts would have been preferable. However, the basic data were more than five years old and the maps necessary to make an enumeration district assignment are not available in Washington. These are stored at the Bureau of the Census office in Jefferson, Indiana. An assignment by enumeration district might be considered in any subsequent follow-up study, if time permits or need dictates.

A number of plants are in or near small communities outside tracted areas. The estimates of the population near these plants reflect the population of county subdivisions within a 5-mile radius. The areas of the county subdivisions are too large to permit the establishment of distance zones within the 5-mile radius. For the estimates of the population by zones in the untraced areas, it was assumed that the proportion of the population within each distance from the plants was about the same as that of the corresponding zone for the tracted areas as a whole.

Although Illiopolis, Illinois, is in a tracted area, it was treated as outside a tracted area on the recommendation of the local respondent.

The plants considered for inclusion in the survey are shown in Section V.E. Most are listed as given on the EPA/RTP list. Some plants, however, are subsidiaries and are known locally by the subsidiary name, rather than by the name of the parent company. In these instances, the name of the subsidiary is shown in parentheses under the listing of the parent company.

The data on age and sex for areas within tracted areas are from a 100-percent count of the population. With the exception of those under 1 year and those 1 to 4 years of age, the numbers represent consolidation of age groups published in the census tract reports. The age group 5 to 14 years, for example, is the sum of those reported as 5 to 9 and 10 to 14 years. The published tract reports show a total for those under 5 years and a subtotal of those 3 and 4 years old. The number of children under 1 year of age was estimated as one-third of the difference between those under 5 and those 3 and 4 years old.

The data on age for areas outside tracted areas are from unpublished 20-percent sample data for county subdivisions. The data for those 5 years and over represent consolidation of age groups as in the tracted areas. Children under 5, however, are reported as those under 3 and those 3 and 4 years old. The number of children under 1 was estimated as one-third those under 3.

There was one exception made in the procedure for obtaining age by sex for county subdivisions. Such data are published for the municipios (county equivalents) in Puerto Rico. The estimates for the PPG Industries plant in Playa Guayanilla were

based on the assumption that the age-sex distribution of the population in each barrio of a municipio did not differ from that for the total population of the municipio.

In a relatively short period of time the number of plants producing vinyl chloride and related products varies; plants may begin production, cease production, or close. Currently, production is reported to be low because of business conditions. Production, however, is expected to increase with a rise in industrial production generally. It must be remembered that the plants listed are those reported to be in production in July 1975. Furthermore, there are several plants now under construction.

In view of the changing number of plants producing vinyl chloride, a separate listing is given of those plants reported as closed. In any future survey or use of the plant listing, these plants should be contacted to determine whether production has been resumed.

For the sake of accounting for all plants in the EPA/RTP list, those not included in the survey are also given.

In the distribution of the population by distance in Section V, the listing is by State, place, and plant. In some places the plants were located so close to one another that the distance zones could be considered identical. See, however, the exceptions discussed in Section III-C.

It is interesting to note that the distribution of the population by zone and the relative area of each zone correspond rather closely. As shown in the following tabulation, there are only small differences in the percent distribution.

III.A. Population in Each Direction From Each Plant

For each plant or group of nearby plants there is one table in Section V.B. showing the population residing in each of the 16 compass directions from the plant. Each of the 16 directions represents a $22\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ angle within which the resident population has been estimated. These data are presented separately for each 0- $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{4}$ -1, 1-3 and 3-5 mile zone around each plant. In the cases where there was more than one plant, but the plants were close enough together, they were considered as a single point source and the data presented in a single table. In two cases the plants were far enough apart so that this could not be done, but the plants were close enough so that the 5-mile zones around the plants overlapped. These two cases are discussed individually in Sections III.C. and III.D.

Single point sources are located in the following places or combination of places:

To estimate the population around each plant or group of plants, the location of each of these plants was plotted on the appropriate Bureau of the Census maps of 1970 census tracts. To determine the direction that each census tract is from the plant, a transparent template shown below, was constructed showing the $22\frac{1}{2}^\circ$ angle for each of the 16 compass points.

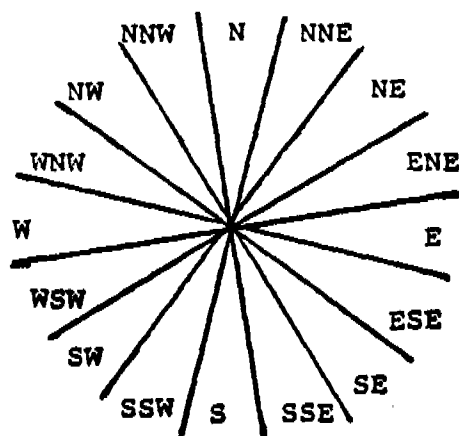


Figure 1. The Direction Template

By placing the center of the template over the plant location one can estimate for each census tract the percentage of its area that lay within each of the 16 compass directions. This assumes that errors will even out in the total. All the populations for a given direction were then added together to obtain an estimate of the total population in that direction. By this method, population estimates were obtained for each of the 16 compass directions for each of the four zones around each plant.

For plants that were located in areas for which the Bureau of the Census does not have census tracts, maps of census county divisions were used and the same procedures were followed as above. Census county divisions are generally larger than census tracts in area, so that the estimates of directions are cruder in these cases. However, this occurs only in the less populous areas, so that the total is affected the least.

III.B. Percent of Time Population is Downwind From Each Plant

The tables in Section V.B., showing the population for each direction and distance from each plant, have been designed to provide maximum flexibility when these data are interpreted or combined with data from other sources. One use of these data is to combine the data for each plant with the frequency of winds from various directions to arrive at a table showing the frequency with which various population groups are downwind from a plant.

For each plant, one can acquire the frequency of the various wind directions for the location of the plant or for the nearest suitable location available for which the data can be assumed to apply. The following is an example of such a wind rose for 8 compass directions. These wind roses also exist with the frequency of each wind direction broken down into the frequency for each of several wind speed intervals. For the data in this report, one would want a 16-point rose.

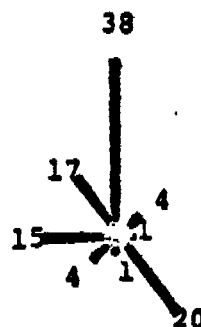


Figure 2. Percent of time wind blows from each direction

One can combine the percents from a 16-point wind rose with the population residing in each direction shown in the tables in section V.B. to arrive at a table as shown below for each plant. These tables can then be added together to arrive at a national total for all plants.

The only problem in applying the above procedures was with populations that are within 5 miles of more than one plant. When the plants were sufficiently close together there was no problem because they could be treated as a single point source of emissions. However, when the plants were far enough apart so that there were times when a given population was downwind from one plant but not from another, there are complications and the procedure had to be modified.

There were two such cases, one in Burlington, New Jersey and one in Fitchburg and Leominster, Massachusetts. These cases are treated individually in sections III.C. and III.D. These sections present the necessary modifications in methodology and the directional data so that, with some suggested simplifying assumptions, the data can be combined with wind rose data to arrive at population downwind data for these cases which can be added to all the other cases to arrive at national totals.

III.C. Population Within 5 Miles of Two Plants

There is one case where the population resides within 5 miles of two plants that were far enough apart to be taken as two separate sources of effluents. This occurs in Burlington, New Jersey. The two plants, Tenneco and Occidental, are within less than ten miles of each other so that the 5-mile zones around the two plants overlap. Note that the cases where there were more than one plant, but the plants were close enough together to be treated as a single point source, have been included in Section III.B.

The population around the Tenneco and Occidental plants can be classified into three categories:

1. Population residing within 5 miles of the Tenneco plant but not within 5 miles of the Occidental plant.
2. Population residing within 5 miles of the Occidental plant but not within 5 miles of the Tenneco plant.
3. Population residing within 5 miles of both plants.

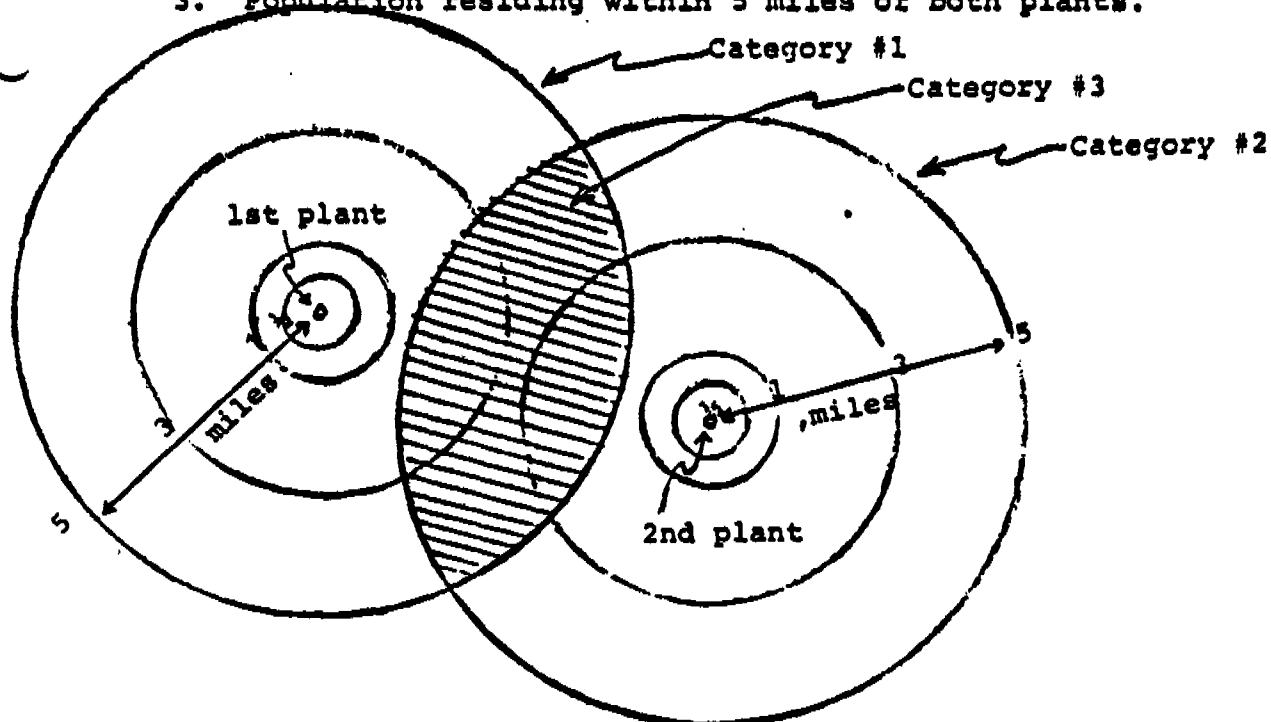


Figure 4. Categories of Population Near Two Plants

All the directional data for these two plants are presented in Section V.C. The first and second categories of population can be treated exactly as has been done in Sections III.A. and III.B., since only one plant is involved in each case.

The third category of population poses some complications in estimating the percent of time that this population is downwind from a plant. For each census tract, the frequencies of the wind direction from each of the two plants must be added together in order to estimate the total percentage of time that the population is downwind from both plants.

One complication is that some census tracts fall within several directions from the first plant, and also several directions from the second plant. The following chart illustrates the case when there are two directions involved from each plant.

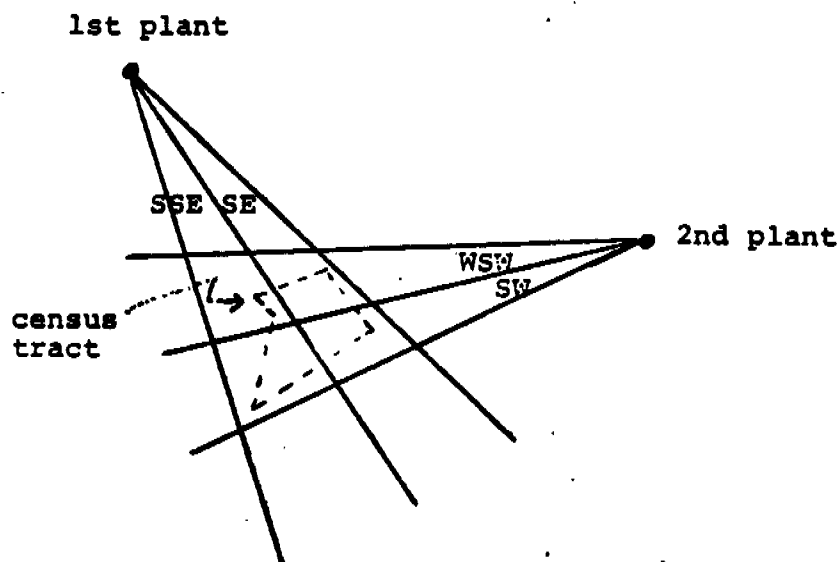


Figure 5. Illustration of a Census Tract at Different Directions from Two Plants.

As seen from the tables in Section V.C., there were often many directions involved from each plant. If one tried to estimate the proportion of the population in each such census tract that lay within a single direction of each of these plants there may be as many as 12 sub-populations in one census tract. This is an excessively large number of small populations to try to estimate from the maps that were available to us. For each census tract, therefore, there is presented the proportion of the population for each direction from the first plant and then there is repeated the same information for the same population for the second plant. It must be borne in mind in interpreting these data in table V.C. that the two lines of data for each census tract represent the same population. In the top line the population is distributed with respect to its direction for the first plant and in the bottom line the same population is distributed with respect to its direction from the second plant.

One can use these data for each census tract to estimate the percent of time a given population is downwind. To do this, one must first multiply the percent of population in one direction from one plant with the percent of population in one direction from the second plant for all combinations of directions to obtain the estimates of the population for each pair of downwind directions. Then one can add the frequencies of the wind direction for each pair of wind directions. When these data are accumulated for all census tracts and all pairs of wind directions, the result will be a table just like the one in Section III.B. so that the data can be combined with other data to produce national totals.

One can reduce the number of pairs of directions before starting these calculations by combining populations in adjoining directions. By judicious combining one can reduce the number of directions for many of the census tracts.

There remains one final complication. If the population in a census tract is in the same distance zone for the two plants, one can perform a straight addition of the two wind frequencies. If, however, the population is in a different distance zone from each of the two plants, one could assign the combined frequency to one or the other zone, thus producing a range for the population estimate within each zone rather than one fixed value. In the table for all plants combined, one could enter such ranges and only after all plants have been included, make an estimate of a single value for each range

For this estimate one could, for example, use the mid-point of the range. If one is unwilling to estimate, he could take the lower value of each range as the minimum population estimate.

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III.D. Population Within 5 Miles of Three Plants

In Fitchburg and Leominster, Massachusetts, some of the population live within five miles of three plants. The three plants, Great American, Foster Grant, and Borden are all less than ten miles of each other so that the 5-mile zones around the three plants overlap. However, the three plants are far enough apart so that they can be considered as separate sources of effluents.

One can classify the population around these three plants into the seven categories shown below. The data for these categories are presented in Section V.D.

1. Population residing within 5 miles of the Great American plant but not within 5 miles of the other two plants.
2. Population residing within 5 miles of the Foster Grant plant but not within 5 miles of the other two plants. (There was no population in this category).
3. Population residing within 5 miles of the Borden plant but not within 5 miles of the other two plants.
4. Population residing within 5 miles of the Great American and the Foster Grant plants but not the Borden plant.
5. Population residing within 5 miles of the Great American and the Borden plants but not the Foster Grant plant. (There was no population in this category).
6. Population residing within 5 miles of the Foster Grant and the Borden plants but not the Great American plant.
7. Population residing within 5 miles of all three plants.

Categories 1-3 can be treated exactly as has been done in Sections III.A. and III.B. since only one plant is involved in each category. Categories 4-6 can be treated exactly as has been done in Section III.C. since only two plants are involved in each category.

Category 7 can be treated in a manner similar to categories 4-6 except that one has to deal in three dimensions instead of two and one would have to do more combining of adjacent directions to keep the number of combinations down to a manageable quantity.

IV. Reliability of the Results

In arriving at the population estimates presented in this report there were some steps in the procedures where judgments had to be made. In every case, an effort was made to make the judgments on an objective basis so that any other persons making the same estimates would arrive at approximately the same results.

These estimates were made using the best information currently available. The most accurate method of determining the population by distance would be a special enumeration of the population such as the Bureau of the Census conducts for governmental bodies. The resultant improvement in the estimates would not, however, seem to justify the costs involved.

The greatest reliability in our estimates is in the population estimates for the 3-5 mile zone. The reliability of the estimates decreases with decreasing distance from the plant. This is because entire census tracts were assigned to one zone. This process becomes least reliable for the 0- $\frac{1}{4}$ zone for several reasons:

1. The area in the 0- $\frac{1}{4}$ mile zone is so small, less than one square mile, so that few census tracts are involved. This means that there are fewer tracts for the effects of assignment by entire tracts to balance out.
2. The plants are usually in industrial districts which are likely to have few or no residents. Tract residents can be expected to live at some distance from the plant; when this is the case, the entire tract was allocated to a more distant zone. However, this could not always be determined with certainty from the census tract maps.

In the less densely populated areas where census county divisions were used because the smaller Bureau of the Census census tracts had not been defined, it is difficult to attribute directions to population groups with much precision. However, this is the best that can be done with the data that are readily available. To achieve greater precision, one would have to survey these areas. This would increase the precision of population estimates for individual locations but would have very little effect on national totals because these areas represent a very small proportion of the total population.
