



## Legislative Report 1997 Regular Session

April 11, 1997

After taking a week off for the spring break, the House and Senate returned to Montgomery, meeting on Tuesday and Thursday and completing the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> legislative days. There are eleven legislative days left in the 1997 Regular Session.

The House returned to face a pending proposal by Representative Albert Hall to provide for open primary elections. The bill, House Bill 179, would make Alabama's election process similar to that of Louisiana where all candidates from parties run together in the primary with the two top vote getters facing each other in the general election. Democrats feeling the heat from the many recent Republican wins in Alabama believe the open primary will raise their electoral chances. The bill faced solid opposition from Republicans and many Democrats. When the House convened on Tuesday, Republicans continued a filibuster which began before the recess for the spring break and the bill failed to receive the necessary votes for consideration. After debating procedural issues relating to the bill, the House adjourned early on Thursday.

In House committee action, or non-action as the case may be, House Bill 303 by Representative Joe Ford, the labor lockout bill, was scheduled again for a vote in the House Commerce, Transportation, and Utilities Committee on Wednesday. However, in the face of strong opposition from the business community, the bill was not brought up for a vote and is likely to not be brought back. The bill would provide unemployment compensation benefits for workers who have been locked out of a plant after labor negotiations have failed. Senator Charles Steele has introduced a similar bill which is pending on the Senate Calendar.

In other House committee action, the House Ways and Means Committee approved a \$949 million General Fund budget. The plan provides for a three percent increase for state employee pay raises and deletes \$30 million for children's program initially proposed by Governor James.

Members of the Senate spent the week working through numerous non-controversial and/or agreed to bills. A substitute unemployment compensation benefit increase which was supported by both business and labor passed the Senate on Tuesday. The compromise substitute bill, Senate Bill 324 by Senator Bobby Denton, would increase the maximum weekly unemployment benefit by \$10 and would increase the minimum income required to qualify for unemployment benefits by raising the minimum benefit by \$23. The bill would also allow the Department of Industrial Relations to use income tax refund checkoff to collect overpayments of unemployment benefits. A compromise House version is pending on the House calendar.

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While Senators works through non-controversial and compromise legislation in the Senate chamber, the real action in the Senator this week was in the **Senate Judiciary Committee** chaired by **Senator Roger Bedford**. The committee held its first day of public hears on the Governor's Tort Reform package made up of the three House-passed bills, **House Bill 299**, **House Bill 301**, and **House Bill 302**. The say the committee showed its trial lawyer leanings would be an understatement. The hear began by a statement from **Lt. Governor Don Siegelman** where he incredibly asked the committee to not report out the bill in their present form but report out "better" bill which would increase the trial lawyer proposed net worth component for consideration of punitive damages.

**Senator Ted Little** arranged for a panel of five "expert lawyers" to assist the committee and be on hand to answer legal questions during the hearing. With the excepting of one leading defense attorney from Birmingham who did a excellent job of answering questions from Bedford, Little and other committee members, the panel was consisted of leading trial lawyer who were allow every opportunity to editorialize, refute points from proponents, and voice opposition to any form of true civil justice reform. The committee heard testimony from many opponents of the legislative package including former U.S. Senator Donald Stuart who is trial lawyer representing some resident of the Anniston area who have files suit against Monsanto. Stuart brought with him some of those residents for effect.

The Committee also heard from proponents of tort reform which included **Attorney General Bill Pryor**, small business owners, and economic developers. Representatives from business testified that the current out-of-line situation here is Alabama hinders their liability to grow and increases their liability insurance. Business owner also testified that they would not like to expose their net worth to a jury (or trial lawyers for that matter) or have to hold separate legal proceedings while lawyers litigated their net worth. A representative of economic developers testified that Alabama reputation for excessive punitive damages is a major "hurdle" which must be overcome when working with industrial prospects.

A special thanks goes out to **Senator Steve Windom** who is quarterbacking the tort reform effort for the Governor in the Senate. The Committee will continue hearing on the package on Wednesday, April 16.

Two environmental bill were introduced in the House and Senate this week. **Senate Bill 659** by **Senator E.B. McClain**, would authorize **ADEM** to adopt, fund and administer a motor vehicle emission control program for Jefferson and Shelby Counties. **House Bill 895** by **Representative Allen Sanderson** would establish a waste tire trust fund and program within the **Alabama Department of Public Health**. **Senator Bill 351** by **Senator Gerald Dial** which creates the **Alabama Drinking Water Finance Authority** passed a procedural vote allowing consideration by the full Senate but final passage was delayed. Also, **Senator Doug Ghee** attempted to bring but his **Conservation Easement** bill. However, the Senator was unable to bring the bill up due to an objection. **Senator Dial** who raised the objection has since removed his objection and the bill could come back up soon.

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Identical legislation has now been introduced in both the House and Senate to clarify the definition of ingredients and components for the purposed of sales and use taxes. The bills will also reverse a proposal by the **Alabama Department of Revenue** to remove the sales and use tax exemption for ingredients and components. The bill revenue neutral and is the result of a compromise between manufacturers, including **AlaChem**, and the Department. **Senate Bill 588** is sponsored by **Senator Tom Butler** and **House Bill 917** bill sponsored by **Representative Ralph Burke**. Both bills are pending in committee.

**Governor Fob James** addressed members of the House this week to answer questions on his legislative initiatives. The Governor indicated that legislators could be back in Montgomery this summer for as many three special sessions "before football season." Special Sessions could be called on tort reform, voter identification, welfare reform, initiative and referendum, and spending for higher education.
