Special and chemical hazards bulletins.

Research constitutes an important phase of the department's program. A continuing study of hazardous chemicals and processes has resulted in an encyclopedia of chemical data related to industrial exposures in the form of *Chemical Hazards Information Series Bulletins*. A companion service known as the *Special Hazards Bulletin Series* provides related coverage of many hazards on which safety information is needed. Representative chemical hazards bulletins cover such subjects as aluminum alkyls, titanium, zirconium, phthalic anhydride, epoxy resins, and acrolein. Representative special hazards bulletins cover swimming pool purification, lasers and masers, insecticides, ultrasonics, and microwave radiation.

Special-interest bulletins

The Association has over 300 special-interest bulletins, covering subjects like salamanders, fire-flow tests, small hose, and other items that do not require the full treatment given a standard.
