To All Members of the Lead Industry Development Committee of the Lead Industries Association, Inc.:

ATTACHED IS THE 1964 CATALOG OF HEALTH AND SAFETY RESEARCH--LEAD.

Also included is a summary of the actions taken by the Health and Safety Committee at its budget meeting on October 23, 1963.

You will note that the Health and Safety Committee reduced the amounts recommended for several of the projects. This is in line with the expectation that additional support for these particular projects will be obtained from other sources to make these particular projects cooperative ventures. An explanation of these reductions follows:

ULC-13 Lead Glasses for Dinnerware

Total cost of the project remains at \$25,000. However, we expect that the U. S. Potters' Association and some of the other interested parties will join in financial sponsorship to a total of at least 50%. This will reduce our commitment to approximately \$ 12,500.

ULC-15 Toxicity Study of Ingested Paint Film

We have a commitment from the National Paint, Varnish and Lacquer Association to support this project in a ratio of 50% of the total cost. This will reduce our commitment to \$10,000.

LC-69 Characteristics of Atmospheric Lead Aerosols

The Health and Safety Committee approved only the first part of this project, the portion dealing with an extension of atmospheric sampling to other geographic areas of the country. This will reduce our commitment to approximately \$8,000, or one-third of the total project cost. The other two-thirds, as before, will be undertaken by Ethyl and Dupont.
