**Monsanto Chemical Salaries
Made Public by SEC**

WASHINGTON — Monsanto Chemical Co. paid its president, Edgar M. Queeny, total remuneration of \$53,618 in 1934, consisting of \$24,750 salary and \$28,868 bonus, according to information made available to the public by the Securities and Exchange Commission. The data on Monsanto had been filed by the company in its permanent registration application with a request for confidential treatment. Following a hearing on the company's request, it was decided that the information was of sufficient importance to investors to merit public disclosure.
