Dear Dr. Scott:

You referred Mr. [redacted] to me on 11-27-50 for examination, treatment and report.

The complaint was of abdominal pain of a week's duration. This began with a "mere stomach-ache" on Monday before he was seen. The pain has been steady and more severe since Friday. There was a constant ache that extended from the lower chest to the symphysis without let up. The pain has made it difficult for him to sleep. For a week there has been no intermi

onset of the pain. He has also noticed that his hands ache when the fists are clinched and he has "no grip". He has also noted that the urine has been "real yellow" when it used to be "like water".

The patient has worked at Fisher Body since August 9 of this year. The first week he was doing filing just outside the booth; since then he has been buffing in the booth, wearing an air supplied hood. Previous to this he drove a cab in Newport and had no factory work.

There is no past history of stomach trouble or previous operations except for the drainage of an abscess of the hip 15 years before. The family, habits and marital histories are essentially non-contributory. The systems history revealed that he felt well and strong up to the on-present illness. He weighed 189 pounds when he started work
