

on possible global arms control

WASHINGTON (AP)—The projected international atoms-for-peace agency should provide important pilot information toward a global arms control set-up.

President Eisenhower, when he first proposed his atomic pool plan to the United Nations in December, 1953, stressed the link between energy for peace on a world scale and those of atomic disarmament.

Diplomatic authorities say it

is now possible to spell out in more detail what those links are as a result of negotiations, here which culminated Wednesday in agreement by the United States, Russia, and 10 other countries on a charter for an atoms-for-peace agency.

These are the chief connecting points now emphasized:
