Subject: Health and Safety Committee
Meeting--Kettering Laboratory
and Worcester Foundation
Proposals

To the Technical Steering Committee
of the Lead Industries Association, Inc.:

At its meeting of November 13, 1962, the Lead Industries Association Health and Safety Committee considered the research proposal submitted by the Worcester Research Foundation, a copy of which was sent to you by E.R.P. on November 2, 1962.

At this same meeting, the Committee also considered the proposal for financial support of research submitted by the Kettering Laboratory, a copy of which was mailed to you by E.R.P. on October 22, 1962.

Following is a summary of the action taken by the Committee on these two proposals.

Proposal for Financial Support of Research.

The Committee recommends support of the proposal as written, in an amount not to exceed \$35,000. The research contractor should provide quarterly progress reports.

The Testing of Organolead Compounds for Possible Endocrinological and Anti-Mammary Tumor Activity.

The Committee does not recommend support of the proposal as written. The Committee agreed with the suggestion of the Director of Research that the proposal be re-written to provide for screening tests of the several compounds, with L.I.A. support limited to \$5,000.

The Committee further recommends that investigation be made of the possibility of submitting these organic lead compounds for routine cancer activity tests to laboratories such as Sloan-Kettering or the National Cancer Institute. It is the Committee's understanding that there is no charge for this latter service.
